Noranda before depreciation, development charges and taxes in the first quarter of 1930 were in excess of \$2,400,000 compared with an estimate of \$3,000,000 made at the annual meeting. The lesser amount is of course due to the drastic drop in copper prices. It is understood that Noranda's costs in the first three months of the year were at the rate of approximately 8 1-2 cents per pound, and it is expected that these can be lowered from 1 cent to 2 cents a pound further during the year. It will therefore be seen that although the company will not be able to earn its full dividend of \$3 a share on 12 cent copper, it can show a substantial profit. It also indicates that Noranda can stand the present unsettlement in the copper market as well as any other company in the business. The price of the stock is sure to follow the fortunes of copper itself. Some large blocks of stock are known to have been picked up around current levels.

**MCCOLL FRONTENAC**  
While the annual report of McColl Frontenac Oil Company, Ltd. for the year ended January 31st, 1930, shows an increase of \$548,734 or 33 percent in gross income and an increase of \$248,635 or 33 percent in amount available for common, the earnings per share of \$1.91 as against \$1.70 in the preceding 13 months are lower than had been generally expected in the Street. It must be stated, however, that the basis for the prior just concluded \$500,000 shares, whereas the earnings for the preceding period were based on an average of \$25,000 shares outstanding.

A striking improvement is indicated in the financial position of the company. As at January 31st, 1930, current assets amounted to \$6,042,917 and current liabilities were \$1,394,376 indicating net working capital of \$4,648,541 and a ratio of 43 to 1 as between current assets and current liabilities. On the corresponding date of the preceding year current assets amounted to \$4,519,403 and current liabilities to \$2,643,084 indicating net working capital of \$1,876,319 and a current ratio of less than 2 to 1.
