Mutch from Dr. Alexander Ross, who is traveling with Mrs. Ross and family by automobile to Vancouver, states that an average of over 200 miles had been maintained in the first five days. The party reached St. John first night, second night Cherryville, Me., third night Portland, Me., fourth night McAdan Jct., and fifth night Port Byron, N. Y. They travelled by the Mohawk trail, and they experienced nothing but first class roads all the way. The trip had gone pleasantly so far and all were enjoying it.

AT ROTARY.—Rotarian J. Harris was chairman at the Rotary luncheon at the Grafton today. The guests included Rotarians J. F. Fraser, Halifax; and J. S. Clark, St. John. Other guests present were Messrs R. B. Messervey, Ross C. Eaton, C. Gavin Duffy, city; J. H. MacDonald, Wolfville and T. E. Powers, St. John. Mr. R. B. Messervey favored the meeting with an excellently rendered solo. Rotarian J. A. Clark had been a delegate at the Rotary International Convention, gave a brief but interesting outline of the remarkable gathering representing America, Europe and Asia and told the meeting of the splendid and elaborate way in which Toronto entertained this tremendous gathering. The speaker of the day was Rev. Dr. J. H. MacDonald of Wolfville, N. S. He delivered a pertinent and inspirational address on "Better Citizenship in the Maritime Provinces." The Reverend doctor is intensely loyal to the Maritimes and showed that these provinces by the sea contained a far greater stock than of the pure bred citizens of any other part of North America as the immigrants from Central Europe did not remain with us but passed through to other parts of Canada. We should be proud indeed to make our boast that we are Canadian citizens and that we are proud of our birthright. He also indicated the passing of capital from the industries promoted and built in the Maritime Provinces to Upper Canada control as something which we should not have permitted works against our development. The doctor wound up his address in a splendid peroration imploring us to develop a Maritime Province voice to speak with united force and which will be heard in the same degree as the voice developed by the big commercial associations and by the railways.

THAT CAR OF YOURS

Bushings cost from 20c to \$10.00 each. There is quite a number in your car. Grease costs about 30c lb and one pound will grease numerous bushings. It does not take a mathematician to see how valuable grease is to a car. Avoid friction. Grease your car thoroughly and avoid many repair bills.

Ques.—There is a large amount of slack in the steering wheel of my model—car. It has been bushed throughout but still has three inches of slack. Fed-up.

Ans.—Remove cap covering steering shaft through chassis and tighten hook arm on to chassis shaft as tightly as you can get it. Tighten on bearing thrust cap at lower end of column above steering housing. This will positively cure the trouble.

Ques.—What causes a car to "Wander" namely not keep in track but roam over the road.

Enquirer.

Ans.—It is apparent that your front axle is out of line or that you have one spring installed back to front. Check alignment of wheels to toe in 3-8 of an inch and see that rear shackles of front springs hang in the same perpendicularity.
