Southern Kings and Queens

Mr. W. S. Hugh, of Murray Harbor, a farmer of outstanding ability, has lately been purchasing cattle in Wood Islands, thus adding to his already large herd.

The writer had recently the privilege of an extended interview with Norman MacLeod, Esq., of Murray River, one of the Conservative representatives of the Murray Harbor districts. Mr. MacLeod has the rare faculty of presenting his views in clear, concise and forcible terms, so that at no time is one at a loss in grasping his meaning. He makes his remarks all the more interesting by a manner vivacious, sincere and persuasive.

The greater part of the harvest has now been safely gathered in barns, stacks and stacks. On the whole it is well up to the average, though somewhat damaged by rust.

The Little Sands breakwater, which has been somewhat dilapidated for some years is being now rebuilt. The sum of \$5000 has been appropriated for this work and perhaps three-fourths of that total has been already expended. Ten or a dozen men have found employment there for the past few weeks.

The old established firm of Macdonald & Son, Murray River, continue to do business on a sound and healthy basis.

The school fair held recently at Murray River was an interesting event, and attracted a large number of visitors. Murray River is the centre for eight or nine schools and every school was represented. The exhibits were fine and reflected credit on the competing schools. Field, garden and orchard products were in full quantity and neatly placed. School work, including drawing, penmanship and seed and leaf collection, were highly creditable. Specimens of various woods were cleverly arranged and various articles of manual work, including hammer handles, milking stools, nail boxes, etc. were also shown. The judging of the foregoing and determination of awards was followed by various games, all watched with interest. Addresses were delivered during the afternoon, and were much appreciated. These addresses were all instructive and suggestive and dealt with every phase of school fair exhibits. Many of the remarks were complimentary to the pupils and teachers who participated. The weather was particularly favorable for the occasion.
