What Makes the Colonel Run?

Battle training is a new term, for a new war. It describes exactly a new type of warfare. It demands better, tougher, harder, fighting men.

Battle training means that fitness is the first essential of our modern armies. And the same fitness is demanded of every soldier from the ranks to the top. The result: younger commanding officers.

Lieutenant-colonels run miles before breakfast with the rest of their units. They work at training with the rest of their units. It is some-thing stronger than the old P.T. and the rest of it. Battle training is constant training and hard work in preparation for constant strain and harder fighting. It is more than the comfortable fifties can take— with few exceptions.

One Division, in England over two years, hasn't a battalion commander who went over with original. Many of them, of course, are holding senior appointments now. But most of the changes are due to the training demanded by a thorough-going commander.

General McNaughton has had a few words to say on the point of leadership that are well worth repeating.

"There is no doubt that in time, as soon as is possible, there will be few lieutenant-colonels over 30 years of age and brigadiers will be commanders not much over that age. In time I expect that even the senior commanders will be men otherwise and it will be much harder than any war we have ever had. There will be no let-up in the strain and the older fellows can't stand the strain. In England we are always ready to move on a few hours' notice.

"Leadership is of the greater importance in this war, probably more than ever before, and officers and men alike must be in condition. They must train like athletes and keep in condition."

Dock Facilities At Pt. DeChene

OTTAWA, June 19—(CP)—Dock facilities are being constructed at Point DeChene, N.B., to facilitate transport of coal from Cape Erection mines to central Canadian markets. It was reported in a reply tabled in the House of Commons today for M. E. McGarry (LIB.) in answer to a question.

In addition to discharging facilities, from ships to cars provision is being made for a stock piling area and railway yard and trackage.

The construction is being undertaken by the Canadian National Railways and is expected to be completed in time to handle a substantial tonnage of coal before the close of navigation this year. The coal will be moved by rail to central Canadian markets, the reply said.
