NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—(CP)—The surprising Detroit Red Wings continued their unbeaten march tonight by gaining a 3-1 victory over the New York Americans in a National Hockey League game. It was Detroit's seventh successive game without a loss. A pair of third-period goals, by Eddie Goodfellow and Sid Howe, broke the deadlock resulting from an early Wing tally by Mud Bruneteau, who scored after eight seconds of play, and the Americans' lone score by Eddie Shore. Bruins Score First Victory Over Rangers

BOSTON, Feb. 6.—(CP)—Boston Bruins, playing in championship form, scored their first victory of the season tonight over New York Rangers, trouncing the National Hockey League leaders 6-2 in a riotous game.

It was the first victory the Stanley Cup titlists registered over the Rangers in the six starts against them since last season's playoffs. Bill Cowley gave the champions a flying start by scoring the first two goals during the first 25 minutes of speedy action.

The Bruins had a 4-0 lead, thanks to other tallies supplied by Red Hamill and Herb Cain, before the Rangers managed to get past Frankie Brimsek with but seven minutes left in the final period. Mac Colville fed his brother Ned a long forward that the latter caged from short range and 14 seconds before the bell Alf Pike counted the Rangers' second goal.
