Mrs. (Rev.) F. P. Dresser and Miss Nellie Hubley, Eldon, were in Charlottetown Saturday.

At the annual meeting of the Provincial Temperance Alliance held in Charlottetown on Thursday a resolution was unanimously passed expressing confidence in Inspectors Jenkins and Mosher and regretting the dismissal of Mr. Gough of Prince County.

Rev. H. S. Erb, Hazelbrook, who had been conducting a special series of services in the Baptist Church, Charlottetown for the past week, left Saturday on return and yesterday occupied the pulpit in his own church. Rev. Mr. Erb created a decidedly favorable impression and his addresses were more than helpful and inspiring.

Michael Paul, Morell Rear, who has been undergoing treatment at the Charlottetown Hospital for a wounded hand left Saturday afternoon for his home. Mike has recovered from the effects of the shot wound but his hand still requires dressing. He expresses great appreciation of the kindness shown him at the hospital and had many kind words for Mrs. Harvey Davison, Morell, who rendered such timely first aid treatment.

The special services held in many of our churches during Passion Week, a St. John exchange, seemed to command a fair degree of interest. On Good Friday afternoon a united Love Feast was held in Carmantham St. church, and was conducted by Rev. W. W. Brewer. Several churches united with Centenary, in the evening, when a public service was held, and Dr. Smyth of Montreal preached, followed by a sacramental service. Both gentlemen are known in this Province.

For years past this Province along with New Brunswick and Nova Scotia have been borrowing money to improve our bridges and roads. This year the Dominion Government, out of the abundant public revenues, offered to give \$13,000 to this Province, \$60,000 to Nova Scotia and proportionally to the other Provinces, but the Senate majority killed the bill. And the leaders of the same majority tried to kill the \$100,000 subsidy to this Province. All of which will call for a lot of explaining when another election comes round.

They departed this life at Long Creek on April 1st after a lingering illness Anna McLean, widow of the late James Cann, formerly of Elmwood, at the advanced age of 91 years. She leaves to mourn one daughter and two sons--Mrs. McQuarrie of Long Creek, Thomas of North Wiltshire, and John of North Pokota besides eighteen grand children and eight great grand-children. The funeral took place on April 2nd to Churchhill Cemetery and was largely attended considering the state of the roads. The funeral services at the house and cemetery was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Miller of Cornwall. To the bereaved relatives their many friends extend their heartfelt sympathy. (Examiner and Patriot please copy.)

T. H. Metherall, one of the largest and most successful men engaged in the lobster industry in this province, returned last week from P. E. Island, where he tried his hand at the profitable and all-absorbing vocation of raising foxes. Although late in the fall when he began operations on the island, Mr. Metherall has met with a fair measure of success, and although reticent on matters of business, he seems well pleased with his labors during the past few months. A group of five valuable black foxes are the chief factors in Mr. Metherall's ranch, and this summer it is expected the batch will be greatly increased. To a North Sydney Herald representative "Mr. Metherall said that foxes are foxes in P. E. Island, and that all the prospective herds have been bargained for; in fact the breeders could not even begin to fill the demand. As a natural consequence prices are soaring, as was noticed the other day when a dealer in the Island paid \$21,000 for a pair of blacks. Therefore the outlook is bright for those engaged in the business. Mr. Metherall is now busy preparing for the season's lobster catch, which promises to be a good one in Cape Breton--North Sydney Herald.
