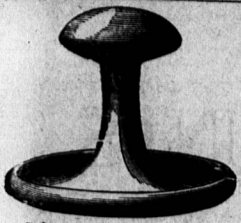

SUPREME COURT.

The Supreme Court opened at 11 a. m. and petit jury called.

King vs. Bernard Murphy, indictment for stabbing. The prisoner a boy of 12 years of age is charged with having stabbed and assaulted a boy 14 years old in Sept last. The defence was that the prisoner was under 14 years old and the Crown should prove a guilty knowledge. Verdict guilty with a strong recommendation to mercy. Prisoner discharged on recognition to appear for sentence when called on. Attorney General for crown. A. L. Fraser for prisoner.

King vs. John A. McDonald indictment for stabbing his son. Defence was self defence. Verdict: guilty, with recommendation for mercy.

E. F. Ryan defended the prisoner very ably and was highly complimented by the Attorney General for the manner in which he conducted the prisoner's case.

The civil cases commence this morning.

TWO FAMILIES WERE STARVING

PORTLAND, ME., Feb 27.—A fisherman brought the story to this city of the helpless, starving condition of two families of 14 persons on an isolated island near New Meadows River about 25 miles from Portland.

These are the only inhabitants of the island, and their nearest neighbors are negroes, on Malaga Island, some eight miles away. The families are those of William H. Beaver and Albert Markham and Beaver's daughter, the wife of Markham's eldest son. They are employed as fishermen, but had lost their only small boat and could not get away from the island to get food. Finally they managed to build a boat, and went to Malaga Island where they got food and supplies. The three-year-old Markham boy is quite sick as a result of being nearly starved.

VANDERBILT WAS MOBBED AT PISA

FLORENCE, Feb. 26.—The incident at Pontedera, 14 miles from Pisa, yesterday, which involved the detention there of Mr. and Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt, junior and their chauffeur for running over a boy turns out to have been much more serious than at first reported. It now appears that Mr. Vanderbilt and his chauffeur were mobbed, that the former drew a revolver and that both Mr. Vanderbilt and the chauffeur were arrested and taken to the police station.

Eventually an officer of gendarmes with reinforcements arrived on the scene and after the townspeople had somewhat calmed down succeeded in rescuing the automobilists, who were taken to the police station, followed by a crowd of shouting people. The leaders protested vigorously against the alleged carelessness of the automobilists and said that it was time to put a stop to such incidents, which were increasing. Mr. Vanderbilt and the chauffeur were detained at the police station, under arrest, and Mrs. Vanderbilt, who was shown every consideration and attention possible, was escorted to the hotel.
