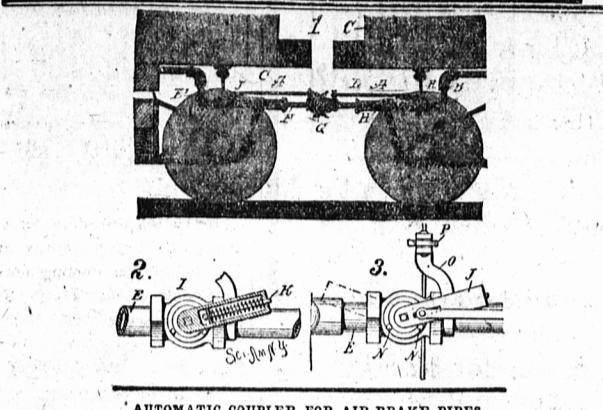

Coming home at night through Munn's Road, Alfred, being unacquainted for many years, lost his latitude and was proceeding under a dead reckoning when he ran foul of a wire fence. In extracting his sleigh he broke the shaft, but making his way to the hospitable home of John A. Fraser, damages were repaired, enabling him to reach harbor safely.

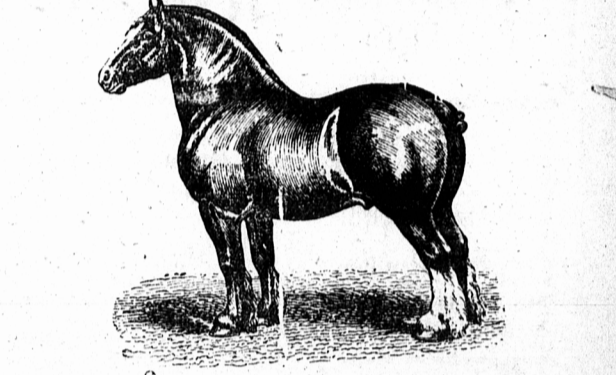
