Remote Asir Resists Contact With Outsiders

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The Emir of Asir is dead and buried in his capital at Sabia, and has been succeeded by his son; but it has remained for the National Geographic Society to call the attention of the world to his passing and to the romantic existence of the little nation over which he reigned.

Asir is a principality situated on the Arabian shore of the Red Sea, says a bulletin issued by the society, and has existed with little change probably since the Israelites traversed that body of water dry shod. Phoenicians, Venetians and Portuguese have coasted along its sandy shores and since the Suez Canal was completed, steamers from all parts of the world have passed in sight of its beaches. Yet the country is little known to travelers.

One reason for this is that the inhabitants are fanatic Mohammedans. Not only are Christians not wanted, but even the Turks, who also are Moslems and representatives of the Caliph, are their enemies. In fact during her war with Turkey in 1911-12, Italy managed to gain the alliance of the Emir of Asir against Constantinople. Nominally Asir was a part of the Turkish Empire, but the people never surrendered their independence. While the Turks held several garrison towns, very little of the country's area was ever explored by them.

There is nothing along the Red Sea coast of the country to attract the traveler, for it is hot and barren and fever-ridden. But the high plateau behind which rises the interior of Asir, is a land of much water and of gardens fields and orchards.

ALL THE LANGUAGES OF THE WORLD ARE HEARD AT LAUSANNE

LAUSANNE, Aug. 7.—Lausanne tucked away in the quiet mountains of Lake Geneva—is a veritable Tower of Babel.

Every language of the world—it seems—may be heard in the streets in the movies and around the hotels. Scene of the Near East confers. Lausanne has broadened its self out into more than what it was in the days when one heard of it merely as a pleasure resort or a town in Switzerland.

Always a place of diversified languages—at the border of French speaking and German speaking Switzerland—Lausanne soon accustomed itself to hearing Turkish, Greek, Russian and most everything scattered promiscuously about the air.

The situation has become so complex that banking institutions plaster their walls with signs written in almost every known language. An announcement in a store window looks like the instructions in all languages one finds in the back of one's American passport.

And to accompany this mixture of tongues Lausanne decorates itself with the flags of all the nation's interested in the peace conference there. The rising sun of Japan flaps in the wind alongside the tricolor of France and the flags of other lands involved.

"It's some job," declared the hotel porter at the biggest hotel. "Every Turk, Greek and what not thinks I can talk his language. I only know five or six tongues—but that's not a starter. Fortunately most of them speak French or English—and that let's me in."
