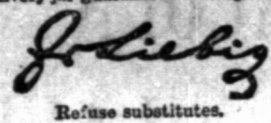

CANADIAN TRADE.

As is well-known by every one giving the slightest study to the matter Canada sells and buys chiefly in two great markets, those of the United Kingdom and the United States. Adding together what we buy and what we sell our total trade with these two countries is not far from equal.

But when we come to divide up what we bought last year of the two countries it will be found that there is a very great contrast indeed. We bought last year of the United States a value of \$95,007,166 and we bought of Britain only the value of \$36,016,648.

There are several reasons why we buy so largely in the United States, the chief reasons being: the nearness of the two countries, which are in touch with each other for 3,000 miles; the great facilities afforded by railway and steamship lines intersecting the boundary; the short time required by goods in transit; the fact that the United States produces articles required by Canada which are not produced in England, such as cotton, corn, tobacco; the nearness of American coal fields to our large central provinces which have no coal; and the fact that American manufactures, while now equally low in price with those of other countries, are better adapted to our tastes and requirements in many lines than those of British or European make.

It must not be thought because we buy more largely in the United States than in Britain that the preferential tariff has been of no effect. On the contrary it has produced what might be considered striking results. Previous to the days of the preferential tariff our purchases in the British market had declined at a startling rate. In 1873 we bought of Britain to the value of \$68,522,776. In 1897 we bought only \$29,412,188 worth.

Turning now from what we buy to what we sell in the markets of the two countries we are met with an equally striking contrast. Formerly we sold more largely of our products to the United States than to the Mother Country. Now we are selling much more to the Mother Country than to the United States.

Here will be seen at a glance the great increase of our sales in the British market and the merely nominal increase in our sales to the United States during the same time. The fact is that almost two thirds of what we have to sell abroad is purchased by the Mother Country.
