Urges Speedy Peace Treaty With Japan

TOKYO, March 17—(AP)—Gen. MacArthur declared today that a peace treaty with Japan should be made quickly, abolishing the occupation and leaving future guidance of this country to the United Nations.

"If the United Nations ever is to succeed, this is the most favorable opportunity it ever had," the occupation commander told American correspondents at a luncheon.

What War Cost The Soviet Union

MOSCOW, March 18 — (Tues.) — (AP) — Foreign Minister Molotov told the four-power foreign ministers' council today that the German and Japanese war cost the Soviet Union a total of \$387,000,000,000.

He said the Soviet Union suffered destruction by the Germans of 1,710 towns; 7,000 villages, and 6,000,000 buildings which made 25,000,000 persons homeless.

Molotov also declared that more than 35,000 factories and 40,000 hospitals were destroyed.
