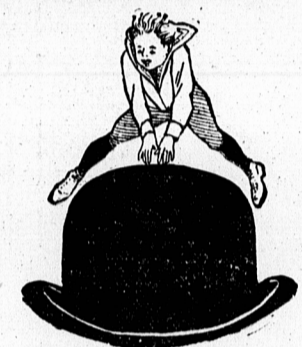

About one o'clock yesterday afternoon quite a number of spectators gathered in front of Haszard & Moore's store, Grafton Street, city, when two large dogs belonging to parties residing opposite one another on Elm Avenue met in mortal combat. The two canines put up one of the stiffest and most stubborn fights seen for quite a while and during their attempts to destroy one another most strenuous efforts were made to separate them. They were pulled apart, beaten with sticks. An owner of one of the dogs broke a stout cane over the animal's nose and amonia was used, but it was not until a liberal application of cold water was made that their ardor was cooled and the strife ceased after about a twenty minutes' conflict.

On March 25th the residents of North Rustco assembled in the school house to consider the advisability of constructing a hall at that place. The meeting was called to order and Thomas Doyle was appointed chairman. Cyriac Buote acted as secretary. Thomas Doyle opened the meeting with a few very able remarks by which he explained the purpose of the meeting. Simon Pinzau, Samuel Nelson and others, by their forcible arguments, showed the urgent necessity of having a public hall in this vicinity and the disadvantages that both the fishermen and farmers of this locality were labouring under for the want of a suitable place in order to exchange opinions and views pertaining to their respective occupations. A committee of seven was appointed to solicit subscriptions to obtain the necessary funds for the erection of the hall. They purpose to be in readiness to call for tenders by the first part of August. This would give them time to have the hall completed for the coming year.

At a recent meeting in Edmonton a branch of the Canadian Handicrafts Guild was formed. An exchange, referring to the new branch and its work says: That the advice and assistance of the Canadian Handicrafts Guild is being increasingly realized and appreciated by earnest people interested in the material development of the country, is again demonstrated by a request, is again demonstrated by a representative and exhibit to the annual seed fair, held by the Provincial Government at Summerside this month. There are many desirable weavers and rugmakers in the Island province and it was felt strongly that their talents might and should be developed along even more artistic and practical lines and become of increasing benefit to those who already had them, and encouragement given to others to learn, hence the request from the Summerside branch of the Canadian Handicrafts Guild for a representative from headquarters in Montreal. In response to this Miss K. Campbell has gone to Summerside and before her return will visit Charlottetown, Halifax, St. John, Moncton and Pictou. At each of these places she will give a lecture, illustrating, by about 50 lantern views, the work and workers of the Canadian Handicrafts Guild.
