THE KING CONTINUES TO IMPROVE

His Majesty Had Fair Day, Doctors State in Evening Bulletin.

LONDON, Jan. 3.—King George had a fair day after experiencing a restless night and there was no change to report in his condition when the evening medical bulletin was issued at eight p.m.

It was also noted tonight that the visits of the physicians at the palace and their consultations were daily becoming briefer.

There was an undoubted lessening of public anxiety over King George's condition by a disposition to accept the home secretary's confident belief that the worst was over.

King George today entered the seventh week of his serious illness. It was indicated in Palace circles that today's bulletin was not regarded as unsatisfactory.

There has been no definite check in the progress he has been making. This it was noted, would appear to indicate that His Majesty, has slightly better reserve of strength upon which to draw.

FOCH PAYS TRIBUTE TO CANADIANS

Canadian Troops Will Live in History as the Men Who Saved Ypres, Says Famous Field Marshal.

PARIS, Jan. 3.—In a New Year's message to the people of Canada given today in a special interview Marshal Foch, generalissimo of the allied armies during the closing years of the war, pays striking tribute to the valor of the Canadian forces, and the part they played in the final triumph of the allied cause.

"One cannot," he said to me, "speak too highly of the magnificent valor of the Canadian contingents at various phases of the struggle against the enemy hordes, equipped with all the machinery that methods of barbarism could suggest to them."

To my former comrades in arms who have returned to their normal occupations and their homes I and my most cordial greetings and wish them and theirs all the happiness they deserve in the year that lies ahead.
