THE ELECTION TODAY.

This is election day in Queen's County for the repeal of the Scott Act and we trust a goodly number of the electors will rally to the polls to effect that purpose. The great privilege of the ballot cannot be better employed than in a movement for the moral uplifting of the country. That is the real object of the prohibition voters at the election—to bring in the most effective measure which the wisdom of the time has devised for the suppression of the liquor traffic.

Every step forward in this movement has been taken by popular vote. In each of the counties it was the votes of the people that brought the Scott Act into force. The votes of the people in the plebiscites of 1893 and 1898 prepared the way for the enactment of the Prohibition Act of 1900. To bring this Act into force the electors of Prince and Kings counties have by large majorities repealed the older and less effective Scott Act. It remains for the electors of Queen's today to complete the work and to bring this County into line with the rest of the Province in this great progressive movement.

Remember that the Prohibition Act as now amended and perfected is an up-to-date measure adapted to the conditions of the twentieth century. It was enacted by the Legislature, by the concurrence of both parties because the people demanded it. It has been approved by the highest courts as a constitutional measure. Best of all, it has been tested for five years in the principal shipping and business centres of the Province and has proved from the first to be superior to any measure before tried, and has from year to year become more and more effective. The temperance electors owe it to

themselves and to their children, to the men who have labored for prohibition in the past, and to the Legislature which has given us this good law, to go to the polls today and set the seal of their approval upon it by their vote. This they can do by voting "against" the Scott Act today. Whether it be the first vote of some young elector, or the last vote of some venerable freeman, it cannot be more worthily bestowed than for this purpose. If these lines should be read by some one who hesitates as to whether it is worth while to go to the polls today, we trust he may decide to go. Every vote adds one to the weight of the verdict at the polls. The impression made by a big majority for a good cause is of itself a good thing.
