ON Saturday evening Lieut. J. A. McDONALD, Charlottetown in Messrs. Rogers & Rogers' office made the preliminary arrangements for the organization of a company of Infantry to be established in Summerside.

THERE was quite a fall of snow in the western part of the Province on Saturday. Reports from Tignish and Alberton say that there were some two or three feet of snow on the ground in that vicinity, but during the latter part of the day rain fell and it soon disappeared. In Summerside the storm was chiefly rain and wind, there were a few slight flurries of snow but not enough to whiten the ground.

### MARKET FOR DEAD HORSES.

HAMILTON, May 1.—A company is being formed here to start a new industry, a factory for the manufacture of paint from animal oil. There is no factory of that kind in Canada at present.

By this process, it is said, good paint can be made from the oil of nearly all kinds of animals. Old dead horses, dogs, cats and other animals will be boiled up for their oil. It is the intention of those interested to start a factory near the Freeman fertilizing works.
