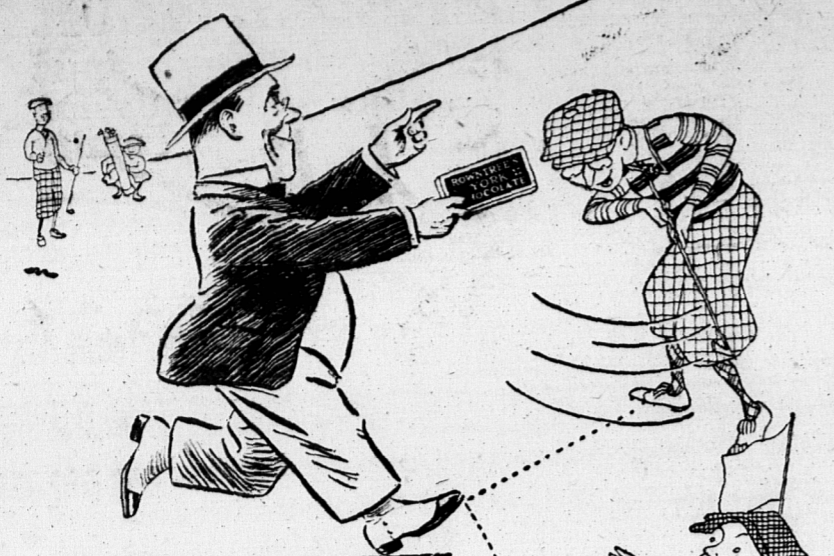

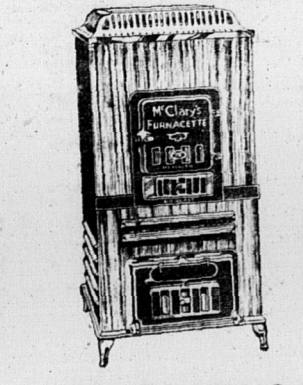

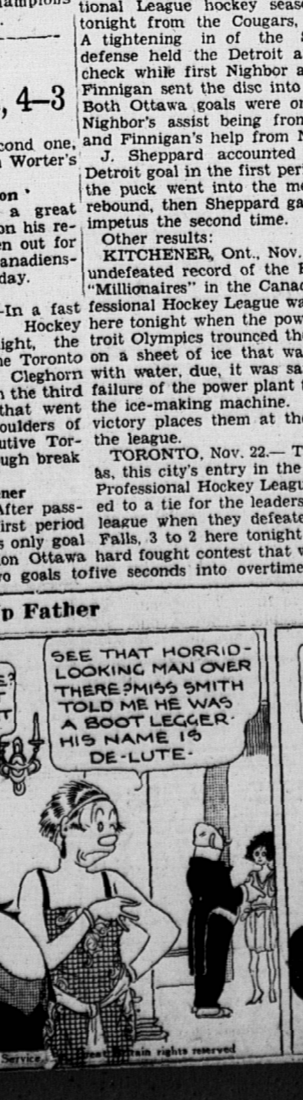
Pay For Athletes Opposed By A. A. U.
