PLAN TO FILL DANUBE WITH BARGES

VIENNA, Dec. 12.—At the moment is being written for the historic old Danube made famous in song, music and story almost everywhere. Prosaic Danube boatmen who care but little about waiting are looking forward to next summer which promises to be the busiest, in a transportation way, in the river's history.

Dredges have been at work on the river, and this natural trade route through central Europe to the Black Sea, Constantinople and Odessa has been greatly improved, developed. New outfalls with large carrying capacity are being built for the spring trade, and transportation facilities are being developed.

Completion of the Danube-Rhine and the Danube-Elbe canals also will add to the river's importance as a shipping route.

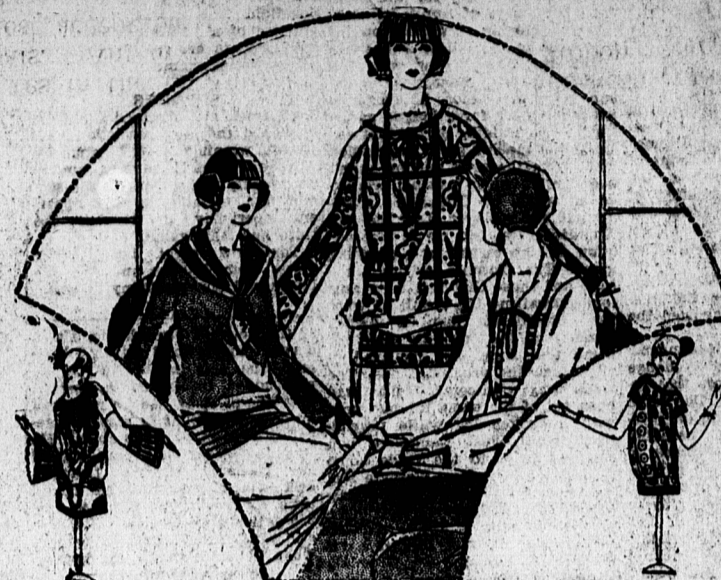
