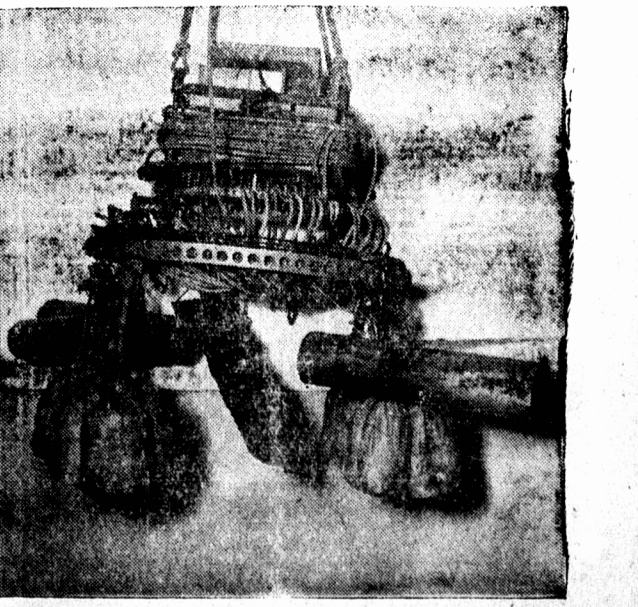

**Jap Balloon Carried Fire Threat to Canada**

Japanese balloons, carrying high explosive and incendiary  
bombs, landed in the densely wooded areas of British Columbia  
and the Prairie Provinces since early in the year and might have  
caused widespread fires had the attack occurred in the summer  
months. A drawing (left), of the Jap balloon was made from  
parts recovered during these attacks. At the right is the "chan-  
deller" which carried the mechanism and bombs. The balloon,  
constructed of tough paper, 33 feet in diameter and carrying  
19,000 cubic feet of hydrogen gas was designed to operate at a  
height of nearly five miles and to stay aloft for about one week.  
On the main balloon were 19 shroud lines, each 45 feet long, con-  
nected to the "chandeller." The "chandeller" contained 72 holes  
with blow-out plugs in all but two holes. The plugs were electrically  
operated from a battery to release sand-bag ballasts when the  
balloon ascended too high. The mechanism was arranged to drop  
the ballasts after the ballast had been released. The whole  
mechanism was designed to destroy itself when the load was  
dropped. Here it carries ballast bags, incendiary canisters and
