BICYCLE ROAD RACE

The date of The Guardian's bicycle road race has been definitely fixed for August twenty-eighth. Entries are to be confined to Prince Edward Island riders also. The race is for The Guardian's three-year trophy; but in addition there is a gold medal to the winner of this year's race. W. N. Tanton, jeweler, of this City, offers a silver trophy to the one who wins second place. W. E. Moran of the Union Commercial College offers a silver medal. The Canada Cycle and Motor Co., through their local representative Ernest Rice offer a silver butter cooler which they value at ten dollars, and J. A. S. Bayer of Ganvia Cabinet & Co. offers one half dozen cabinet photos.

The course begins at The Guardian office in Charlottetown and follows Grafton Street to Great George Street, thence continuing on to the Upper Malpeque Road which it follows to this side Mill station, thence taking the road to the left which runs alongside Moore's Mill stream and on to Warr's Corner, North River. From this corner the course will be across the North River Bridge to the Royal Arms, thence by Lower Malpeque Road to Brighton Road, following Brighton Road out to the shore, then taking the Park Roadway, following the same round the Park and so to starting place—16 miles.
