Weekly Livestock Market Report

SUMMARY
Livestock markets opened steady to strong but, due to the uncer- tain labour situation, prices de- clined around midweek when the larger buyers were out of the mar- ket. Sales were then made mostly to butchers at a reduction of 25c to 50c on most cattle. Onl, minor changes were noted in other clas- ses, with hogs strong sellers, but lambs lower at principal centres.

Eastern Markets
After a strong opening, cattle prices dropped 25c or more at Toronto. Buying toward the end of the week was confined to the smaller buyers but they cleared the offering by the close. Closing rates on weighty steers were up to \$15 after an early top of \$15.50, and butcher steers finished at \$11 to \$14. Early trading was strong at Montreal, with prices advancing 25c to 50c but with the advent of the strike on Wednesday morning a considerable volume of stock was not slaughtered. Most of these cattle were shipped out to eastern Ontario points to be held on pas- ture until killing operations are resumed. Good steers were placed at \$14 to \$18 and good cows gen- erally \$10 to \$11. In the Maritimes, good and choice steers and heif- ers were quoted up to \$12.50 f.o.b. country points.

Western Markets
Cattle receipts continued light at Winnipeg and the market op- ened fully steady but receded sharply on Wednesday in view of the threatened strike in the pack- ing industry. A cleanup, however, was looked for by the end of the week. Most killing steers looked 25c to 50c lower, with the best around \$13 to \$14, odd choice up to \$15, and good cows \$9 to \$9.50. Feeder cattle also appeared to ease off, with the best quality at \$10 to \$11. At Calgary the market opened active but was practically at a standstill on Thursday, with prices quoted 25c to 50c lower on all butchers. Best steers were placed at \$13.25 to \$14. Similar conditions prevailed elsewhere throughout the west with Edmon- ton selling steers up to \$14; Prince Albert up to \$13, with good \$12 to \$12.50; Moose Jaw up to \$14; Saskatoon \$11.50 to \$12.50 for medium quality; Regina \$14; and Vancouver \$13.50 to \$14. These prices apply to every case.

Exports to United States
Shipments of dairy cattle to the United States for the week total- ed 1,706 compared with 1,548 in the same week last year. This year's exports to date are 35,404 and last year in the same period were 49,090.

Gains in eastern calf markets:
Fairly strong gains were made at Toronto and Montreal on strong calf markets. Toronto paid \$15.50 to \$16.50 for choice veals and Montreal was up 50c to \$1.00 on grass calves and strong on good veals at \$15.50 to \$16. In the west there was little change, Winnipeg paying \$12 to \$13, with some top light veals \$14 to \$15.50; Calgary \$12 to \$12.50; Edmonton \$12.75; Prince Albert and Moose Jaw \$13; Saskatoon up to \$12.50; and Regina \$14.

Hog Market: Hog prices showed some advance, particularly in the east. Toronto was up 25c, with Grade A hogs at \$23.50, while Montreal paid \$23.75 to \$24. Win- nipeg \$21.95 to \$22.25; Calgary \$22 to \$22.25; Edmonton \$22.50; Moose Jaw \$21.50; and Vancouver \$21.50 to \$22.50. All prices are for Grade A, the latter f.o.b. country points.

The above prices do not include the Dominion Government premium of \$2 per head on Grade A and \$1 per head on Grade B1 hogs.

Lamb Prices: Lambs dropped 50c at Toronto, closing at \$15.50 for best quality, while Mont- real paid up to \$15, and Winnipeg was down 50c at the close, with tops at \$14. Calgary had good lambs at \$13.50; Edmonton up to \$14; Prince Albert \$12.50; Moose Jaw \$13; Regina \$13.50; and Van- couver \$13.50 to \$14.50. Rail grade lambs were quoted at \$13.75 in the Maritimes.
