SEEK SOLUTION TO PUZZLING ARMS DEADLOCK

LONDON, April 23—An Anglo-Italian agreement on policies toward the League of Nations and clearing the beclouded arms deadlock is the desired goal of conversations inaugurated today by British ministers and Fulvio Suvich, Italian under-secretary for Foreign Affairs.

Favor Move

They are both inclined to favor, in principle, the move to have Russia join the family of nations but it was reliably indicated they may make important reservations to the plan.

Return Essential
