—CLIPPING FROM AN OLD ISLAND PAPER—The recent death of Mrs. H. A. Compton, of Summerside, formerly Miss Sophie Clark, of Charlottetown, has brought to light some interesting facts. From an old paper is clipped the following item:—"From England comes the news that ball-bearings for railway carriages have recently been given a very thorough test and have proved satisfactory. In one of the tests a 27-ton coach was pushed along by one worker whereas seven men have hard work to push such a heavy coach not equipped with roller bearings. If such bearings prove their value after tests of use in train travel, it will mean a saving of about thirty per cent. in fuel. It will interest many to know that the original patent for ball-bearings was taken out over fifty years ago by the late Watson Duchemin, of Charlottetown, (grandfather of Mrs. H. A. Compton, of Summerside), for roller bearing ships' blocks. The invention became so popular that in a short time it was adopted not only by the shipping, but also by every block making system. So perfect was the very first model that modern science has failed to make perceptible improvement within the half century. The modern ball bearing lacks the durability of the old roller bearing and it is even a question as to its being more easy running. Some of the old blocks still exist after fifty years of service, and the well thought out principle has been a benefaction to the motor mechanism of the whole world."—S.
