PORTUGUESE ROUT AFRICAN TRIP WITH HEAVY LOSS

LISBON, Feb. 11.—Advices from Mozambique, Africa, say that the notorious native chief Napana recently raided the Nampula district of Mozambique, massacring a large number of European settlers. The governor immediately despatched a punitive expedition of 1,000 men. After a march of nearly 400 miles in the broiling sun the expedition came upon the chief and his band and completely routed them, after five hours' fighting, killing 200 and wounding 500. The Portuguese lost four men killed and twenty-two wounded. The victory is considered very important, because a new region will be open for Portuguese development.

STRANDED SCHOONER FLOATED

ROCKLAND, Me., Feb. 11.—The three-masted schooner Rebecca J. Moulton, of New London (Conn.), which went ashore on Two Bush Ledge, on eastern Penobscot Bay, yesterday, was floated by a tug and towed to this port to-day. She had twelve feet of water in her hold.

COLD DROVE JAP RIOTERS FROM THE STREETS.

TOKIO, Japan, Feb. 11.—The rioting and disorders which broke out in the Japanese capital yesterday, in connection with the Cabinet crisis continued until the early hours of this morning, when the mobs dispersed owing to the intense cold and the lack of further objectives on which to vent their fury. Up to noon today there were no further disturbances in the city, and the authorities decided to withdraw the patrols of soldiers from the streets.
