CLAIMS FOR DAMAGES.—Mr. J. Cuthbertson Doyle, secretary of the Retail Merchants' Association, who was in Charlottetown several days ago, yesterday presented to the Halifax city board of control claims for riot damages amounting in all to \$8,502.35. He said the claims were those of merchants, directly or indirectly, of the restaurant section of the association, and he submitted there was with the city a moral, if not legal, responsibility to make good the losses, and he simply presented the statements as submitted to him. He referred particularly to the amount of money actually stolen, amounting to \$600 from two of the cafes alone. The total claim is from five of them.
