New Superplane on Trial in Germany

BERLIN, Oct. 6.—A new Junker's double-decked superplane with a surface measurement of 109 square yards, is being tried out in Germany in a series of test flights. The body of this giant plane is nine feet, ten inches wide and comprises two platforms with a cabin space for 20 beds as well as for heavy baggage. Adjoining there is a special freight compartment for the shipment of express freight, the absence of which hitherto has been found a vital shortcoming in aerial service.

Another innovation is an auxiliary engine room with a separate motor for lighting, for the accelerated filling of tanks, wireless and other services. With the progressive development of airplanes to such dimensions the continual expansion of aerodromes of the international service has become an urgent necessity. At Tempelhof for example, not even the latest hangars still in process of construction are adequate in size for the new superplanes which, consequently have to be parked outside.
