**P. E. I. Leading in Percentage Grade A Hogs For All Canada**

Prince Edward Island leads all Canada with approximately 46% of a grade hogs, reports Mr. H.W. Day, Dominion Livestock Grader. This favourable position is due largely to the superior type of Yorkshire breeding stock developed in recent years by the local breeders who have emphasized market utility and not fat and fanciful in spite of this merit in our breeding stock there is grave danger that the percentage of top grade hogs in this Province will decrease due to an unimproved condition at market weights.

"Considering present day domestic consumer demands, pork cuts must not carry excess fat. The fat covering on all shoulders and hams must be removed to leave only about one half inch on the lean meat. Bacon is not favored if it carries much fat and little lean. This is understandable when we consider that the housewife is not pleased when she has to trim the fat in the kitchen, but one wants to pay bacon price for it. The fat trimmings cut from the shoulder and back and the leaf lard from inside the ribs never return to the packer the price per pound that was paid for the whole carcass. In the export trade, the overfat hogs result in low grade bacon and sells for a lower price on the market. All swine producers should realize that the overfat hog lessens the profit for all parties concerned. At the present time, a hog dressing 150 pounds and grading B1 due to overfatness, is sold to the producer of one dollar in government premium and forty cents per hundred pounds, or a total of one dollar and six cents. To make this loss more serious, we know that this excess fat was the most expensive gain put on the hog.

"With the present system of making returns to the farmer, certain symbols are used to indicate the defects in each carcass. If a hog dressed too fat, the producer will find "P" in the weight of that hog. If the carcass is too thin, "T" is used. If the carcass is short and fat, the letter "S" is used. If the carcass is heavy in the shoulders, the letter "V" is used. This information should prompt the producer to adjust his practices of feeding and management to avoid this condition in future shipments.

**Chief Causes**

The chief causes of overfatness in market hogs may be found among the following:

1. Hogper feeding.
2. Forced feeding when hogs are growing.
3. Lack of protein in the ration.
4. Breeding stock poor in type, too short and thick.
5. Vitamin and mineral starvation.
6. Marketing hogs too near maximum weight.

"Hogper feeding has been condemned by our most successful hog growers. They found that the hog ate too much, took too little exercise and consequently developed into a short over-fat carcass which would not grade well. It is generally agreed that hogs should never be placed on hogper feeding under three months of age. Some few swine men can produce a grade hogs on hogper feeding, but these men are the exception. Some of the best light rations with much dark shorts and oats and little barley and wheat. Some shut the hogs about 9:00 a.m. and open it at 4:00 p.m. with a feed of mangos at noon. Producers who are now using self feeders and find that their hogs are grading too low due to overfatness would be well advised to change to stop feeding.

"Contrary to the opinion of many farmers some years ago, any healthy hog can be finished in a period of three weeks or more if the proper ration is used. For this reason, it is a mistake to force feed a pig during the growing period. A young pig takes too little exercise; if given all the feed, it will eat it and fatten up. It should be to grow the pig first and finish it after it reaches 150 pounds live weight.

**PEI LEADING**

"Protein supplements have been scarce during certain months of the year. This no doubt has resulted in many farmers using a growing ration too low in protein. This results in slow growth and excess fat. If hog producers would arrange in advance for their protein needs, similarly as they do for their fertilizer, they could secure more such supplements than they are getting now. During June, July and August, fish meal, tankage and other animal protein feeds can be obtained much more easily than during the winter months.

"In some districts in the province, unfortunately in some heavy hog producing areas, swine men appear to take very little interest in the type of their breeding stock, particularly in their bred sows. Too many old sows which reach the packing plants are defective in type. Too many are short with heavy shoulders. In fact some districts have been allowing their breeding stock to decline in quality from year to year. It is claimed that one large hog producer in this Province who markets upwards of five hundred hogs a year, and who some years ago had a low percentage of top grade, now ships about 80 percent grade A. He claims that the improvement is due largely to his efforts in obtaining and selecting better breeding stock. Results at the Test Stations across Canada show that pigs from different litters, bred on a standard ration, vary in type and finish to a surprising degree when marketed. Breeding stock with type defects should find its place in our Canadian Swine Industry.

**Lack of Vitamins**

"The lack of vitamins and minerals in the ration has a direct influence on the conformation of the hogs which suffer such deficiencies. Lack of Vitamin A—the growth producing vitamin—stunt the pig and result in a short side, heavy shoulders and a deep chest. Lack of Vitamin D prevents the body from assimilating the lime in the ration and thus interferes with the normal development of skeleton. If the growing pig has access to green leaves of grass, clovers, rape

should make at least 75 percent, grade without any greater effort than a little more care on the part of the farmers in shipping at the proper weights and feeding some of their hogs so carry less finish. Hogper feeding should be used with caution if at all and never on pigs under three months old. Producers who plan to feed any number of hogs should plan in advance for their protein supply and not run the danger of being caught short in the middle of the feeding period. The brood sows should be culled to eliminate at least the one-half which are defective in type. Some districts are using hogs of unknown ancestry and questionable individual merit. The vitamin and mineral content of the hog ration should not be overlooked, especially for the brood sow and the young growing pig. About one third of our hogs now shipped at 160 to 170 pounds dressed and overfinished hogs will dress between 140 and 160 pounds and carry less finish. With one hog in every five outside the Grade A weights, we have evidence that too many producers are not weighing their hogs immediately before shipping. A little more attention to these factors would give Island hogs at least 75 percent Grade A.
