Railless L. C. C. Cars

LONDON, Dec. 7.—In a report to the London County Council the Highways Committee recommend the construction and the equipment on the trolley vehicle (railless) system of a service of cars from West Norwood to Lee Green. The length of the route is about eight miles and the estimated cost £148,670. This proposal would form a very important cross-town connection. It would provide, in conjunction with existing tramway routes, direct means of communication between Norwood, Crystal Palace, Sydenham, Catford, and Lee Green. It would also assist to serve two very large housing estates in course of development—namely, Bellingham and Grove

Park, being in close proximity to the former and within a mile of the latter.

Ranchers' Contentment

WINNIPEG, Dec. 7.—Expressing the belief that Southern Alberta is naturally a ranching country and an unsafe country to farm in George Lane, widely-known rancher of the Bar-U ranch, Alberta, when interviewed here, deplored the falling off in population of the small towns scattered throughout the southern ranching districts as shown by the recent census.

"It has been demonstrated by this time that a lot of the country in Southern Alberta and Southern Saskatchewan is ranching land, suited to no other kind of agricultural use," Mr. Lane said. "For my part," he continued, "I have always said so, and have always acted up on my belief that it was an ideal country to ranch in. This was seen by Sir Clifford Sifton, who, when Minister of the Interior, had the country mapped out for ranching and for ranching only, based on the advice and experience of some of the best experts in his department. His decision has proved to have been absolutely right.

"The shrinking populations are it may said," Mr. Lane declared, "the latest evidence of the rightfulness of the position Sir Clifford took in the matter. If other proofs be looked for, I have only to mention the fact that the country which was so profitable as a ranching area, has under the present settled from coast both the Dominion and provincial Governments millions of dollars, which they have expended in trying to uphold and keep on the land the people who were unwisely allowed to go in there at the outset."

A DAY OF SURPRISES

Meighen Government Goes Down to Defeat Under an Avalanche of Ballots. Prime Minister Defeated in Own Constituency

OTTAWA, Dec. 7.—By decisive majorities the Meighen administration yesterday was defeated at the polls and a Liberal ministry will rise in its stead. It was a day of surprises. Liberals scored even beyond their most sanguine expectations. They expected the largest group in the next House. They will have a clear majority over all parties combined. In the three Provinces of P. E. I., N. S. and Quebec they swept every seat, they made inroads into Ontario and the West. The new National Progressive Party, while it will stand second in the next House, did not secure its expected support east of the Great Lakes. In the Maritime Provinces it merely retained its existing seat, Victoria and Carleton, in New Brunswick. In Ontario, instead of sweeping the rural ridings its victories totalled nineteen seats. The chief strength of the Progressive movement lay in the Prairie provinces which gave it birth. In the next House, however, to judge from returns so far available the Progressives will form the official opposition. The Government has retained little more than a third of the seats held at the dissolution. The Prime Minister was defeated in his own constituency and with him were defeated eight members of his administration. The defeated cabinet ministers were, Meighen, Prime Minister; Normand, President of the Privy Council; Monty, Secretary of State; Bellefleur, Postmaster; Fautex, Solicitor General; Ballantyne, Minister of Marine; Spinney, Minister without portfolio; McCurdy, Minister of Public Works; Wilson, Minister without portfolio. Of the number five, Messrs. Normand, Monty Bellefleur, Fautex and Wilson had been members of the Cabinet only once since Mr. Meighen re-organized his Cabinet in September. Two defeated ministers, the Prime Minister and the Hon. James Wilson were beaten by Progressives, the others were beaten by Liberals. One lady was elected, Miss MacPhail, Progressive candidate South-east Grey, Ont. She will be the first woman to sit in Canada's House of Commons. Among the familiar faces missing in next House will be Dr. Clark, advocate of free trade, who was defeated by a Progressive in Mackenzie, Sask., as a Liberal.

CLEANING YOUR RAINCOAT.

Benzine shouldn't be used in cleaning your raincoat. Neither should turpentine, for it will dissolve the rubber in the garment and utterly ruin it. To clean your raincoat spread it out on the kitchen table, the longest bench you have or else clean it a portion at a time on your washboard. In this way the water runs off of it. Make a soap solution with a good soap and luke warm water. Scrub the coat vigorously all over with this, using a nice straw brush for the scrubbing. The garment should be scrubbed inside and out and if very dirty it may need going over twice. Rinse in three waters, being especially careful to get all of the soap out for soap left in the mater-
