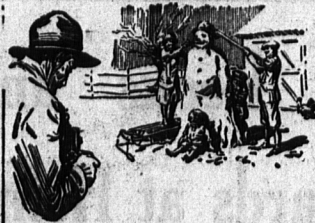

URGE CONFISCATION OF ALL FOOD STORES

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

NORTH BAY, Dec. 7.—At a meeting of the North Bay Council this afternoon a resolution was passed calling upon the Federal Government to regulate the price of food, by seizing all stocks of wheat stored in elevators and all foods in cold storage warehouses, allowing the owner a fair profit and that all factories, flour and cereal mills, sugar refineries, canning and preserving factories and packing houses, together with their storehouses and contents, and also that coal mines be commandeered and be operated by a commission appointed by the Government and when necessary to commandeer railway cars or railroads to transport fuel. To make it illegal for any person or persons, whether manufacturer, miner, wholesaler, to refuse to sell of the commodities necessary for domestic use to any other person or persons for legal tender in quantities and at prices usually sold to the trade.
