QUESTION AS TO CHURCH OF NATION

In a letter To the London Spectator he Objects to The Title of Nonconformist Being Applied to Those Who Are Without The Episcopal Church.

LONDON, Aug. 22.—The Tribune says a letter which throws into wide contrast the conditions obtaining among the religious communities in this country and the colonies is appearing in this week's Spectator from Professor Workman of Montreal.

In the course of the letter Professor Workman says:—"It is common with a growing number of Britons throughout the world I think it strange that you should not only speak of the Episcopal churches in England as the Church of the nation, but almost describe those Christian men and women who do not worship in its buildings as nonconformists. When you contend in your issue of August 4th that the Church of England is the national church because she does not exclude any Christian Englishmen from her ministrations if they are willing to use them, and because she is comprehensive enough in doctrine to allow a great variety of belief I fail to see the force of your contention that the Roman Catholic Church does not exclude any Christian Englishmen from her ministrations if they are willing to use them. But that fact does not make her the Church of the nation and to be comprehensive enough in the matter of doctrine and to allow a great variety of belief does not make any church a national church, much less the church of the nation. Besides Christianity is not a matter of doctrine or belief, but a matter of life and conduct.

"I do not understand how you can claim that these persons who do not use her ministrations are in law and in fact members of the national church. The majority of the English people have been neither baptized nor confirmed at the Episcopal Church and unless they were so baptized and confirmed they would be refused communion in that Church, and the ministers who baptized them would not be admitted into pulpits of that Church. JEROME SPEAKS ON SITUATION

NEW YORK, August 25.—District Attorney Jerome again talked of the political situation of this state. He said he believed the time was now ripe for the many leaders of Tammany Hall to state their positions. He also declared that Mr. Hearst, as a man, did not figure in the coming campaign.

Mr. Jerome said that he received up to date many endorsements of his candidacy as he did last year, in the comparative time from his public announcement that he would run for office.

ALLEGED BURSTING OF LEE ENFIELDS

TORONTO, Aug. 25.—Considerable discussion is going on just now in a quiet way in military circles regarding the number of Lee-Enfield rifles which have burst at the different rifle matches and military camps this fall. The first of these resulted in the death of a volunteer at London, his rifle bursting and blowing a piece of the mechanism into his brain.

At the same time another man was wounded. At the recent Province of Quebec Rifle Association matches, two rifles exploded in exactly the same manner, luckily without serious results, and similar mishaps have been reported from various parts of the country. As the Lee-Enfield rifles, have been in use in former years without any such mishaps, there is a quiet movement on foot to have a Government investigation to find out whether the accidents are caused by defective mechanism or bad ammunition.

SOLDIERS BURNED IN FOREST FIRE

PARIS, August 25.—A forest fire broke out at Mont Gaume, near Toulon, the other day. A detachment of the 11th regiment of the line, which was sent to assist in putting out the fire, were caught in the valley, and before they escaped four men were burned to death, and eighteen others injured. Several other members of the detachment disappeared. The fire is still raging and there is great excitement. The authorities of Toulon have gone to the scene.
