PRESIDENT WILSON UNMASKS GERMANY For a long time President Wilson seemed to be blind to the issues of the war, though there is evidence to support the theory that he saw from the first, and only waited until the masses of the American people saw for themselves.

The Meaning of the Flag In his opening paragraph, President Wilson said: "My fellow citizens—We meet to celebrate Flag Day because this flag which we honor and under which we serve is the emblem of our unity, our power, our thought, and purpose as a nation."

Peace Denied United States He continued: "It is plain enough how we were forced into the war. The extraordinary insults and aggressions of the Imperial German Government left us no self-respecting choice but to take up arms in defence of our rights as a free people and of our honor as a sovereign Government."

Germany's Present Aims He then went into detail, explaining the present German plan. Germany no longer hoped to aggrandize herself at the expense of her enemies. She would dine off her friends.
