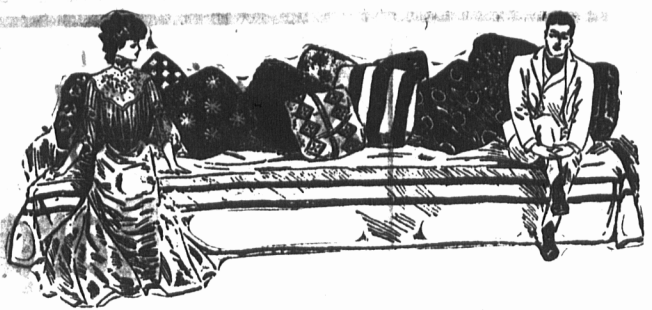




Scrambled eggs (not cooked too much) with "FORCE" makes a pretty good breakfast.

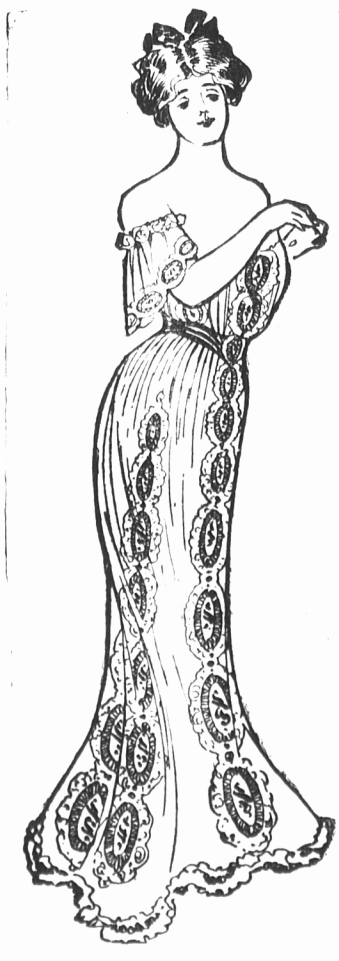
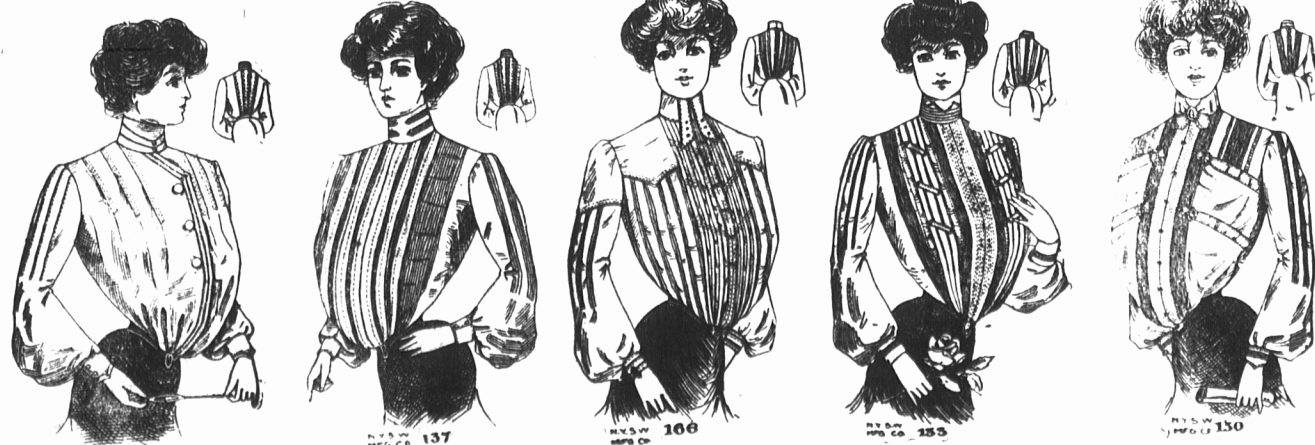
