THE TELIGRAPH QUESTION SETTLED.

We are glad to learn that a telegram was yesterday received from Ottawa announcing the important information that arrangements are completed between the Government of Canada and the Anglo-American Telegraph Company of London whereby we are to have the all night service and the reduced rates put in operation without delay.

While this is a measure of simple justice to the people of the city and Island, it has been so long and so ardently contended for in the face of many delays and discouragements that it will be accepted as a great boon by the community.

THE FEDERAL ELECTION.

The Dominion Parliament has been dissolved and a general election ordered, to take place on November 3rd. The last general election was held November 7, 1900, making the duration of the Ninth Parliament, now dissolved, four years less four days.

We are already within four weeks of nomination day, which is fixed for October 27. The contest will therefore be short and sharp. And it will be a great contest. Both parties will fight with the hope of winning till the last vote is polled.

The ministerial campaign has its weak points. Things are in bad shape for the Liberals in the great Province of Ontario. In two important centres of the Maritime Provinces, St. John and Charlottetown, as well as in several places of less importance, councils are divided and candidates have yet to finally be selected.

The Opposition is distinctly weak in the big Province of Quebec, and in less degree in Nova Scotia. The veteran Sir Richard Cartwright has taken refuge in the Senate. Other changes may be expected and it will not be surprising if we have "piper's news" from both the political camps within the next few days.

HELP NOT ASKED FOR.

The Patriot tells that the Provincial Government at its last meeting considered the question of the shortage of hay on the Island. A committee was appointed consisting of Hon. Messrs. Peters, Rogers, Cumminskey and Forbes to deal with the matter.

They formulated a plan for the importation of hay from Quebec where the crop has been plentiful. They also communicated with the Minister of Railways asking for free or cheap transportation. Hon. Mr. Emerson promptly wired offering free transportation of hay on the Government Railways.

We fear this action and the wide publicity given it may convey the impression abroad of destitution in Prince Edward Island that does not exist. The hay crop has been short, but there is old hay over from last year. Our farmers are generally prosperous and far from being impoverished. They have not asked for either federal or provincial aid.

Hon. J. H. Cumminskey will be acting Provincial Secretary and Commissioner of Agriculture in place of Hon. B. Rogers resigned, until a new appointment is made.

TOWN IN A PANIC.

ISLAND FALLS, Me., Sept. 28.—An explosion in the grinder building at F. W. Hunt & Co.'s tannery this evening started a blaze that threw the town into a panic, as it was believed that the entire plant and surrounding property, valued at half a million dollars, would be destroyed. The absence of wind and prompt action of the local firemen in raising several small sheds in the immediate vicinity of the fire confined the flames to the grinder building. The loss will not exceed \$5,000.
