**WINTERS IN CANADA NOT BECOMING MILDER**

TORONTO, Dec 8.—The winters in Canada are not becoming milder, as many persons suppose, according to A. J. Connors, M. A., climatologist in the meteorological service of Canada.

"On December 30, 1875," he remarked, "there was a registration in this city of a maximum of sixty one degrees. On no December day before then and on none since so far as our records go, has there been such a high temperature in December until the first day of this month, when the official registration was recorded at 60.5."

"The winters may be warmer at short periods but taken over a long period, this is not the case. Some time ago Sir Frederick Stupart spent a good deal of time getting data on this matter for a lecture. We even looked up the letters of the Jesuit fathers to get the earliest possible records, and while there are short periods of climatic variation, a sort of irregular pulsation, you might say, it is not the case that the weather is growing milder except during these fluctuations. There are variations every fifteen, twenty or thirty years, not regularly occurring, but coming and going when the seasons may be colder or warmer for a few years, but
