are few and simple. Good posture gives the lungs plenty of room to expand, enabling them to breathe in pure air and, more important, breathe out impure air. With shoulders well back, the heart also has plenty of room to work. The erect carriage means that the abdomen is drawn up by the abdominal muscles. The development of these abdominal muscles holds all the abdominal organs in their proper positions, thus aiding digestion and preventing constipation. The erect carriage helps mentally and emotionally by giving an air of confidence and general ability. 1. Stand and sit tall. 2. Keep chin down. 3. Draw abdomen in, trying to pull it backward and upward. This raises the shoulders and throws them back. 4. Try to flatten hollow in back by drawing buttocks forward. Two simple exercises are used for the purpose of strengthening the abdominal muscles which really hold body erect. They should be done twice daily. 1. Try to touch toes with knees straight 10 times, gradually increasing to 20 times. 2. Lying on back raise both legs, with knees straight to a right angle with body, forming two sides of a square. Do this six times, gradually increasing to 12 times.

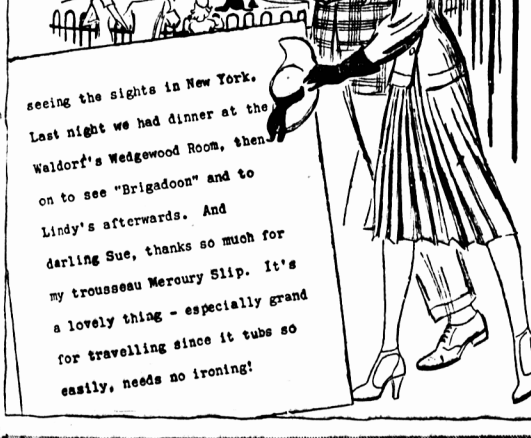

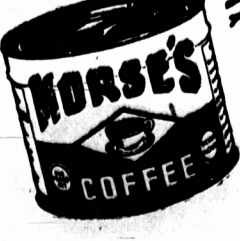
