Criticize Long Use Of Chateau Laurier In Freight Hearing

OTTAWA, March 27 — (CP) — Ottawa's famed Chateau Laurier came in for its share of criticism today when Senator W. Rupert Davies (L-Ontario) protested before the Senate tourist traffic committee that for the last six weeks the big hotel, owned and operated by the Canadian National Railways, has been filled with railway officials attending the present freight-rate hearings.

Senator Davies said the hotel has had to turn away visitors to Ottawa through lack of accommodation. "If this situation is allowed to continue into summer, the hotel will lose a number of wealthy American tourists," he added. Committee members decided to hold further meetings to discuss the present tourist situation in Canada. Leo Dolan, director of the Canadian Travel Bureau, will appear as a witness at a later meeting.

Fear Death Toll Will Reach 111

CENTRALIA, Ill., March 27 — (AP) — Centralia made plans today to bury its miner dead, as rescue squads combed methodically through a network of mine tunnels, virtually resigned that the death toll in Tuesday's underground explosion would rise to 111.

Tired, dust-stained rescue workers brought 18 more bodies up the shaft of the Centralia Coal Company's No. 5 mine nearly today, but they still found no signs of life among the 78 miners still unaccounted for. No survivor has been found since 31 men were rescued from the gas-contaminated mine the first few hours after the blast.

the life imprisonment imposed on Evelyn in connection with the baby's death. Meanwhile the Crown has appealed a verdict by which Mrs. Dick was acquitted on retrial of the torso murder of her husband, John. In the original hearing she was sentenced to be hanged.

On questioning by G. A. Martin, defence counsel for Bobozuk, 29-year-old former steel worker, Mrs. Alexandra MacLean, Evelyn's mother, testified that her daughter had contributed considerable money to the household, including a \$3,500 downpayment on the purchase of the family's Carrick Avenue home. She said her bank account was "about \$10,000" and when asked how much was received from her daughter she replied: "Perhaps \$3,000 or \$6,000."

Mrs. MacLean admitted the money came rapidly from Evelyn after the birth of her daughter's first child, five-year-old Heather, now living at the MacLean home, but she did not know where it came from. "But there was some connection between that money and the birth of Heather?" asked Mr. Martin. "Yes," replied Mrs. MacLean. Evelyn had told her "Norman White" was the father of Heather but had never said who fathered her second child, stillborn.

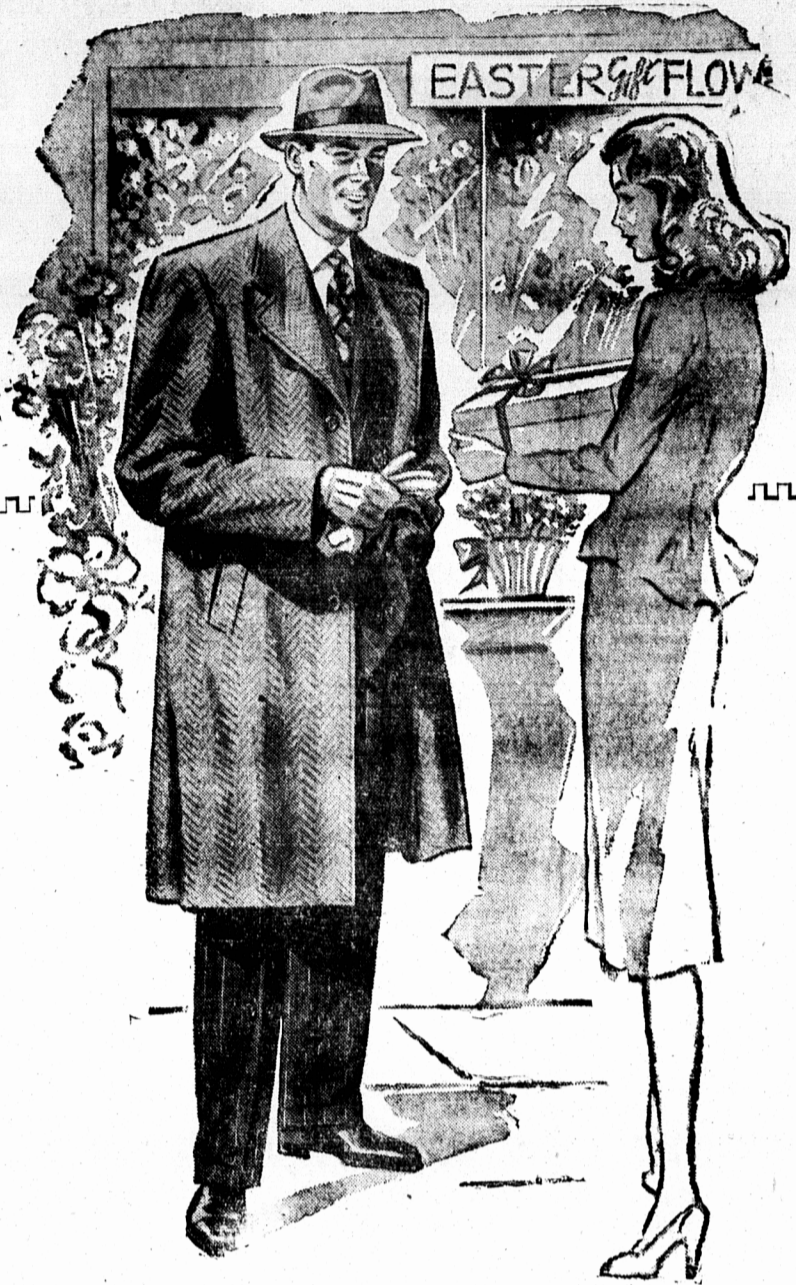

manufacturing, mining, logging, utilities of all kinds, construction, banking and large segments of the retail, wholesale and service industries. These groups expect to spend "a little over \$1,000,000,000 on new capital goods—70 per cent more than the estimated outlay achieved in 1946.

"If to this amount are added what appear to be reasonable objectives for the year in other private investment fields, an aggregate capital expenditure program of something over \$1,700,000,000 is obtained. This program is 33 per cent above the outlay achieved in 1946."

According to the basic and building material report, "significant" production increases are expected during 1947 for some of the 10 basic materials reviewed. Production intentions for 1947 of manufacturers of 29 types of building materials showed a general improvement. Showing increases of less than 10 per cent were cement, structural tile, gypsum wallboard, lath and plaster, cast iron radiators, and paints, varnishes and lacquers. Increases of 10 to 19 per cent

are expected in concrete brick and building blocks, cement drain pipe, sewer pipe, water pipe and culvert tile, building brick, vitrified flue linings and sewer pipe, asphalt shingles, smooth and mineral roofing products, steel pipes, tubes and fittings, wash basins, hot water storage tanks, builders' hardware and rigid insulating boards.

Increases of between 20 and 30 per cent are expected in production of bulk rock wool, cast iron soil pipe and fittings, sinks, furnaces, electric water heaters, wire nails and spikes. Window glass, most of which is imported, also fell in this category.

Increases of 40 per cent or more are expected in rock wool batts, bath tubs and non-metallic sheathed cable.

Blonde Girl Hopes To Cross Niagara On Wire

HOLLYWOOD, Fla., March 26 — (AP)—A vivacious blonde girl with a winsome smile believed she's going to win permission to cross Niagara gorge on a tight wire this summer, just as her great grandfather, the celebrated Blondin, did some 30 years ago.

The girl is Josephine Berosini, 21, who came to the United States from Czechoslovakia with her theatrical family in 1939 and is now living near Hollywood.

The Niagara Falls Commission, in answer to her persistent pleadings by mail, "refused her the right to risk her life over the gorge, but she says she's going to continue pestering them."

Her father, Joseph, 49, head of the Berosini Troupe, says she could cross it without any trouble.

Josephine who weighs 125 pounds and is five feet, 5 1-2 inches tall, with blue eyes and wavy honey-colored hair, has been practising all winter on a 600-foot wire, carry-

Lobster Lose Heavily In Storm

YARMOUTH, N. S., March 27 — Fishermen today described yesterday's gale as the worst lobster gear "smasher" since the fishing season opened last Dec. 1.

Although the wind was not as strong as in some winter gales it blew in from the southwest sweeping even the sheltered inshore areas. Fishermen said accurate estimate of damage could be made until the seas abated.

Price of lobsters, now at 40 cents a pound, was expected to go higher because of the scarcity due to the storm.
