DIVORCE DOES NOT ALWAYS REMEDY A BAD SITUATION

When Marriage is Failure, Wife Should Give Careful Thought Before Asking Legal Separation

Dear Miss Dix—My husband is a weakling and rotten at the core. He is unfaithful to me, does not love me, has no use for me except for his services as a housekeeper and my ministering to his comfort. He loves, so far as he is capable, a girl who is very sweet and fine and who is alone in the world. And I think she loves him, too. But he is too much of a coward to divorce me and risk the censure which he would receive. Why do I not take some action? Well, I do not wish to be a divorced woman. I do not wish to be a laughing stock in the eyes of the world, no matter how poor a specimen of manhood I know him to be. Although he has money enough to support two households comfortably, he does not wish to go through the inconvenience and uncertainty of trying to collect alimony. QUILTED ENSEMBLE FOR BOUDOIR LUXURY. The newest recipe for boudoir glamour is to have your house coat and dressing table skirt made of the same luxuriously quilted material. And you can have it quite inexpensively, too.

First of all, it is a good choice for this purpose. Underneath each piece of cotton satin, or whatever material you select, place a piece of thin cotton padding cut in the same size. Then use the quilting attachment on your sewing machine to stitch through both thicknesses.

Use a simple diamond-shaped motif or, if you like, a more elaborate scroll design. You will be delighted at the quickness and ease of achieving this flattering touch and if you want to carry the idea still further, bedspread and draperies could be treated in the same way.

Don't Scoff at Dreams—Learn Their Meanings. Rub a cotton fabric between the fingers if you wish to determine whether it has been sized. Then use the quilting attachment. The flimsy fabric will crumple under this treatment.

EGG SHAMPOO CAN BE SIMPLE. Here are directions for an egg shampoo: Fill one large fresh egg into a cup and whip it lightly with a fork. Add one-half teaspoon of fresh, strained lemon juice and set the cup within easy reach of the wash bowl in which you intend to shampoo your hair.

Now brush hair and scalp for several minutes. Then, using very warm water and a liquid shampoo for the final rinse is best—not hot. Now pour the whipped egg and lemon juice mixture over your head. With thumb and fingertips, massage the egg into scalp. Keep on massaging for at least five minutes, adding a few drops of tepid water whenever the mixture seems to be getting dry and stiff. Afterward, rinse with a hand spray until your hair is completely clean and your hair "squeaks" when you run your hands through it.

If you do not have a hand spray, at least four rinsings in a bowl are required. Either way, let the shampoo water cool for rinsing. Hot water will cook the egg. If possible, brush your hair in the sunshine until it is dry. Otherwise set it in loose waves and ringlets pinned flat to the head until dry.

To get the most benefit from a hot oil treatment, vigorously massage hot olive oil into hair and scalp the night before you intend to wash your hair, pin a clean towel around your head and go to bed. Next morning shampoo in the regular manner, scraping at least three times and rinsing four.

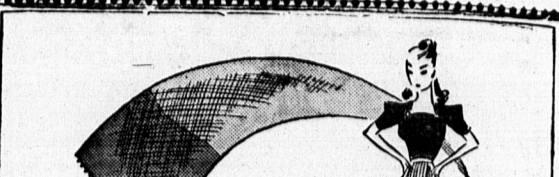
DENTIST INVENTS ABRASIVE GUM TO HELP IMPROVE TEETH. Invention of an abrasive chewing

gum to help correct irregularities in the biting surfaces of teeth was described to the sixteenth annual fall clinic of the Montreal Dental Club by a Canadian dentist.

Dr. W. J. Linghorne, the inventor, is also a practicing dentist in New Liskeard, Ont. He has worked out the abrasive chewing gum with the aid of other research workers on the staff of the University of Toronto, and has tried it with success on a number of his patients.

Dr. Linghorne spoke of methods of grinding down projections which keep teeth in upper and lower jaws from fitting exactly into each other's biting and chewing surfaces.

He recommended, however, that after the mechanical grinding had been done there should be a finer finish given the job through the use of a mastic, chewing gum, which carried abrasive substances in it.
