THE CURSE OF DR CRIPPEN. NANTES Sept. 24.—The British steamer, Montrose, from Quebec is ashore in the river Loire with her stokehold full of water. The Montrose reported ashore in the Loire to-day is the steamer that carried Dr. Harry Crippen, the London wife murderer, and Ethel Le Neve on their flight to America in July 1910. The captain is the ill-fated H. G. Kendall, who was in command of the Empress of Ireland when she was run down and sunk in the lower St Lawrence last May, with loss of over 1,000 lives. After being cleared by the Government inquiry of responsibility in this disaster, Capt. Kendall was sent back to the Montrose. The Montrose, it is surmised, was in French waters as a military transport.

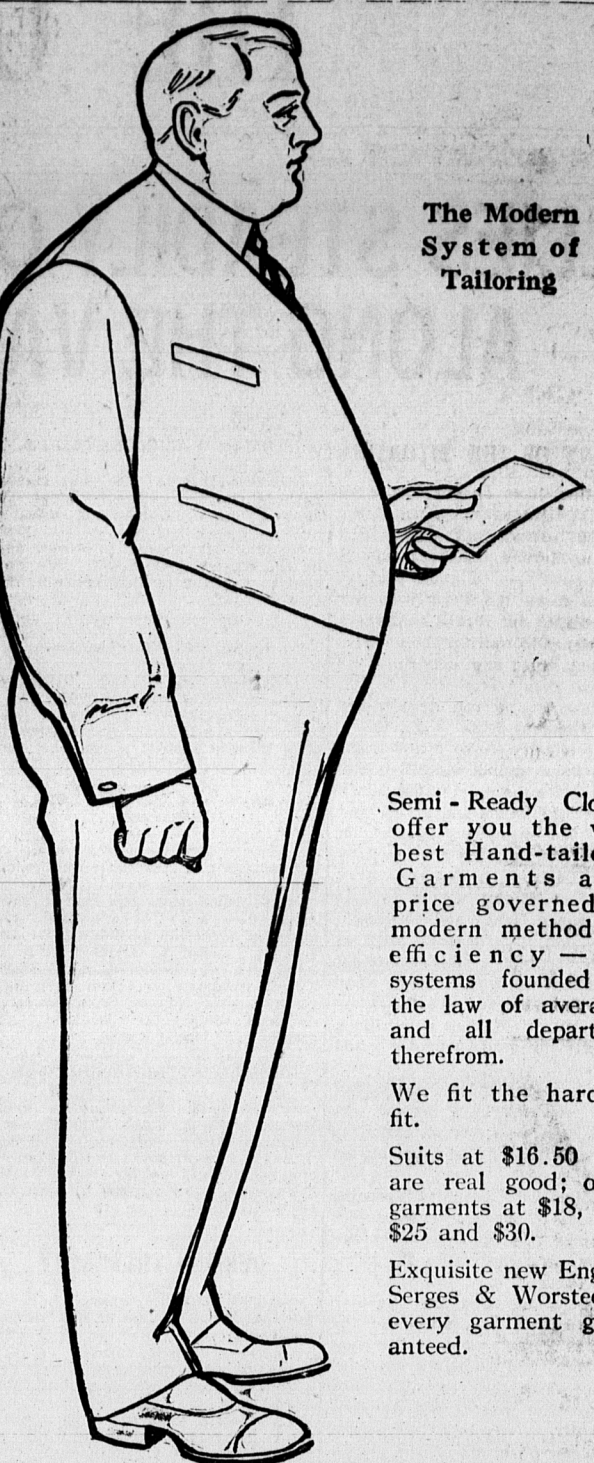

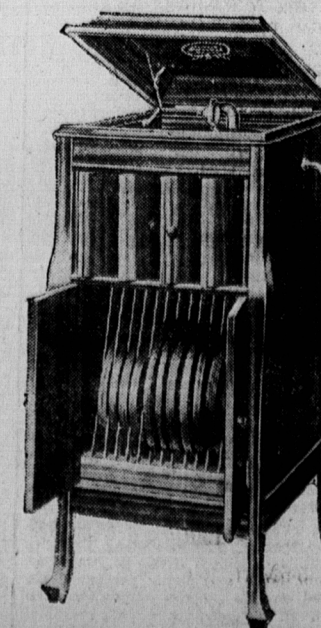
