NEW YORK, Dec. 5—(AP)—Irregularly lower tendencies cropped up in today's stock market although recessions mostly were in minor fractions and modest plus signs were plentiful at the close. Minus signs were predominant among Canadian stocks. McIntyre Mines declined 3-8, Canadian Pacific, Imperial Oil, Lake Shore and Hollinger 1-8, Ford "A" and Walkers 1-4, and International Nickel 1-2. Distillers Seagram and Dome gained 3-8 while Hollinger was unchanged. Blocks of 1,000 to 10,000 shares of low-quoted issues again lifted the volume but the day's aggregate slipped to 976,880 shares after topping the million mark in the three preceding sessions. The Associated Press average of 80 stocks was off .3 of a point at 39.5. On the outside were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, N.Y. Central, Great Northern, Chesapeake & Ohio, American Telephone, Du Pont, Johns-Manville, U.S. Gypsum, Allied Chemical, Dow Chemical and Standard Oil (N.J.). Santa Fe and Southern Pacific edged upward at the last. Advances also were rationed by Youngtown Sheet, U.S. Rubber, Goodrich, General Electric, American Can, Texas Co., Nash-Kelvinator, Warner Bros., Anaconda and Kennecott.

TORONTO, Dec. 5—(CP)—Narrow index losses were compiled by the gold, industrial and western oil stocks today on the Toronto exchange and the base metal issues finished even with Thursday's close. Turnover at 240,000 shares was the heaviest in a month. Interest in the Abitibi issues subsided and in lighter trading the preferred weakened 1-2 to 8 3-4 and the common 5 cents to 65. Other papers were firm. Bathurst Power A firm 1-2. Foods and utilities improved slightly and other groups were unchanged to narrowly lower. McIntyre was the weakest of the senior golds, slipping back 1-2 to 43 1-2 while Lake Shore and Dome weakened minor fractions and losses of 3 to 5 cents were noted by Chesapeake, Hard Rock, Inspiration, Kerr-Addison and MacNickel 1-2. Distillers Seagram and Dome gained 3-8 while Hollinger was unchanged.
