"Drowning Caused by Neglect of Their Companions While Operating a Car Under the Influence of Liquor" is Verdict at Inquest on the Deaths of George Roberts and Albert Youland.

The final sitting of the inquest into the deaths of the late George Roberts and Albert Youland took place in the City Courtroom last evening.

We, the undersigned jury find that George Roberts and Albert Youland came to their deaths by drowning caused by neglect of their companions, Dennis Peters and Louis McCoubrey while operating a car under the influence of liquor.

Mr. Meighen began his Dominion campaign here tonight. He opened with the charge that in every attempt at initiating important legislation, the King Government had bungled and many times been compelled to reverse its proposals and withdraw its bills.
