Fake Schemes Absorb Six Hundred Millions

ANNUAL TOLL TAKEN ON THIS CONTINENT FROM VICTIMS BY VENDORS OF WORTHLESS SECURITIES

Six hundred millions of dollars, probably more, is lost in a year through "get rich quick" schemes launched on this Continent. Earning, spending and saving seem to be big problems for the average man and woman.

A life insurance expert has figured out how the average income is spent, as follows: Out of each dollar 24c goes for living expenses, 22c for luxuries, 14c is wasted, 13c goes for "sundries," 11c is "invested," 8 1/2c pays for crime, 4 1/2c is for the Government, 1 1/2c maintains our schools and 3/4c goes to the churches.

The remarkable thing, however, is that of 11c "invested," three cents goes into life insurance, but that small fraction creates 87 per cent of all estates.

Under the circumstances, the life insurance companies are not out of order when they suggest that more of our incomes be entrusted to them.
