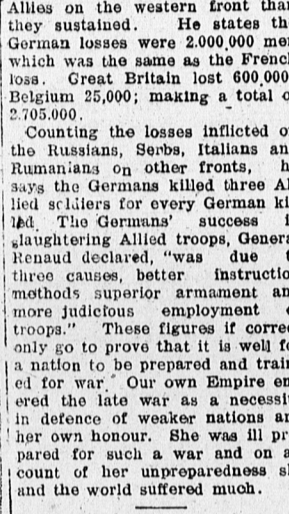
PERSONALS
