SALADS AND SOME HINTS.
 Italian Salad.—This salad is rich in nutriment. Cut equal parts of cold veal, without fat, carrots, celery, artichokes, potatoes and string beans into dice. Add a few green peas and asparagus in their season and dress with mayonnaise. Heap lightly on a dish and garnish with slices of tomatoes or beets cut in pretty shapes. For this salad left overs in the form of cold vegetables should be saved. If you wish a really elaborate effect, line a tube mold with aspic jelly and when partly chilled ornament the jelly with cooked asparagus stalks or tomatoes. When cold turn out upon a dish and serve.

It is with pleasure that another improvement to this city is noted. There has just been completed on the corner of Euston and Spring St. by Ernest Parkman, the builder, a beautiful and substantial dwelling house containing all modern improvements. Credit is due this young enterprising contractor for making the old corner look so well. Mr. Parkman has moved into the corner dwelling himself and the hearty wish of all is that he may meet with even better success in his future home and business.

The following despatch from Providence, R. I., will be of particular interest to patrons of the C. F. F. C. in this Province: Alleging that he took the stump in Canada in opposition to reciprocity in the name of company, unwarrantably the stockholders of the Credit Foncier Canadian, a French-Canadian lumber and real estate corporation, today voted to oust Arthur Laberge, of Montreal, as their vice-president. Only twenty of the 1,800 stockholders voted in person, others being represented by proxies voted by the secretary, Joseph W. Tringue. Mr. Laberge attended the meeting and made an extended speech, claiming that his campaign work in Canada was done entirely as an individual and not in the name of the company. Of the 1,800 stockholders, 1,600 are residents of New England, and others of Canada. The company owns timber tracts in New Brunswick and Quebec.

A Toronto despatch of yesterday says: With the church courts of every denominational body in Canada committed to a policy of opposition towards the Ne Temere decree, a new and powerful movement had been started by the Evangelical alliance of Canada at a meeting held in Toronto. Every leading church of Canadian Protestantism was represented. Ten thousand documents will be issued at once setting forth a case against the decree. A public educational campaign by means of a large mass meeting will be at once inaugurated. Finally a monster petition will be taken by a deputation to the Borden Government and a demand will be made that the marriage laws of Canada be placed beyond church interference. Premier Borden and his cabinet, in effect, will be asked to set aside the Ne Temere Decree as an invasion of the rights of the Canadian parliament and those of certain of the provinces. Petitions will also be laid before every provincial government in the Dominion. As British Columbia and Prince Edward Island control their own marriage laws and retain the privilege of granting divorces, separate requests will be made of them. The government of Ontario will be asked to take steps at the earliest possible moment to have the court of appeal determine the extent and jurisdiction of Canada on the subject of marriage laws.

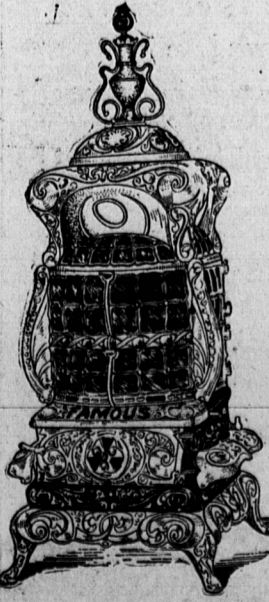
