Dealers in Montague yesterday were paying forty-two cents a bus for oats; 22 to 25 cents a bus for potatoes; twenty-five cents a doz for eggs; ten dollars a ton for loose hay; ten and a quarter cents a lb for pork; twenty-two cents a lb for butter and twenty-five cents a doz for eggs.

Dealers in Souris yesterday were paying five cents a lb for beef; forty cents a bus for oats; twenty-eight cents a bus for potatoes; ten cents a lb for pork; sixteen cents a lb for turkeys; nine and one half cents a pound for hides; and one dollar each for pelts, ten dollars a ton for hay and five dollars a ton for straw.
