Latest From Summerside and Prince County.

THE first annual sign of the approach of navigation has put in appearance by a small opening in the ice at the end of Railway wharf.
A CONGREGATIONAL meeting of O'Leary, Bloomfield and Bras will be held in the Presbyterian Church at O'Leary on Tuesday April 12th at 2.30, p. m.
THE funeral of the late Mrs. Stanley Compton, St. Eleanors took place yesterday afternoon and was very largely attended. Rev. W. B. Sisam officiated.
THE Y spinsters were At Home to a large number of friends at the residence of Major Schurman Thursday evening when a most enjoyable and sociable time was spent.

QUITE a number of the patrons of Crystal Rink took advantage of the skating with Band in attendance Thursday evening. The ice was in comparatively good condition which left hopes for still another or more nights of pleasure on the blades. Last year the latest skating was on Easter Monday which was the latest in the history of the rink; and this year promises to be a record breaker.

BOARD OF TRADE.

A meeting of the Board of Trade was held yesterday forenoon to consider the purchase of the Hotel Davies and the bringing of the winter steamers to Charlottetown.
The report of Capt. John Gillis, Levi Langill, William Yeo and others who took measurements of the ice in the bay was submitted by President Rettebury.
They showed that where the Mit to was stuck there was 3 feet of ice 4 yards from her stem, 2 ft 9 inches at her fore rigging 2 ft 6 inches at midships and 2 feet at her stern. Sixty yards west of her bow there was 18 inches ice and 5 fathoms water, and on towards the city for three miles the ice ranged from 15 to 21 inches and the water from 5 ft to 9 fathoms. Measuring the ice outward starting from a line from the Book House to the Marine Hospital they worked outward 2 1/2 miles measuring every two hundred yards and found from 14 inches to 23 inches of ice.
After discussion it was agreed to send the following telegram.
Minister of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa.
Sorry Minto's attempt to open Charlottetown harbor failed, would respectfully ask department instruct Captain try again, at earliest possible moment, say Monday next.
