The latest news, first of all.

-The following are the Alberton market prices, white oats thirty eight cents, black oats forty cents, pork seven and a half cents, hides seven cents, pressed hay nine dollars loose hay eight dollars, beef five to six cents, butter eighteen to twenty cents, and eggs twenty two cents.

-Dealers in Summerside, yesterday were paying from seven and three quarters to eight and one quarter per lb for pork, eighteen to twenty cents per pound for butter, twenty three cents per dozen for eggs, eight dollars per ton for hay, forty two cents per bush for black oats and forty for white, geese, chickens and ducks per lb ten cent, and turkey fifteen cents.

-Section foreman J. T. McNally of the section from Summerside to Miscouche on the P. E. I. Ry., has applied for and been granted the retiring pension from the Railway to take effect on March 1st. Mr. McNally has been foreman of this section for over twenty years during which time he has always been known as a careful and obliging official. He will be succeeded as foreman by William Gillis, who for the past fifteen years has been on the section with Mr. McNally.

-In the death of James McTague, which occurred at his home in Tignish on Monday evening after a long illness of Bright's Disease, the P.E.I. Railway loses one of its best and oldest officials. Since the opening of the Railway, Mr. McTague has been employed at different stations and for the last twenty eight years has been Station Master at Tignish. He was sixty five years of age and leaves a family of three sons and two daughters, Peter in Duluth, Wm. in Boston and Ernest at home. The daughters are Mrs. Jas. McGrath, Tignish and Georgie at home. Funeral this afternoon at four o'clock. A special train will leave Charlottetown this morning at nine for Tignish with brothers of O. R. T. to assist in the burial service.

-The civic election at Summerside yesterday was hotly contested. The day was fine and the candidates with their workers were out in full force with the result that the vote polled was the largest with one exception ever polled in a civic election at Summerside there being 616 ballots cast seven of which were spoiled. The contest was very close and even while the count was going on the result was in doubt up to the last fifty ballots. The vote polled by each candidate, the first three of whom were elected is as follows: - J. A. Brace 383, J. LeRoy Holman, 380, Dr. A. A. McLellan 375 and Dr. James McDonald 344. A new record was established at this election, there being no less than 81 "plumpers" of which Mr. Brace received 40, Dr. McDonald, 21, Dr. McLellan 16 and Mr. Holman 4.
