UNDER the auspices of the Citizens' League a rousing meeting was held Monday evening in Market Hall. Mr. George W. Warren occupied the chair. Stirring addresses were made by Revs. D. J. G. McDonald, J. M. Withycombe, W. H. Smith, E. J. Grant, Messrs R. C. McLeod, Neil McLeod, and others, dealing almost exclusively with the temperance side of civic politics. The addresses were short, sharp and to the point and the stereotyped plea that citizens had not here-to-fore expressed themselves with sufficient clearness in reference to the enforcement of the Scott Act has for one at least been buried. At the two mass meetings held since the close of the civic year, the best thought of the town was expressed clearly and unequivocally that nothing short of a rigid enforcement of the Act will in the future satisfy public opinion, and this thought found still more tangible expression in yesterday's election, when the whole board nominated by the Citizens' League was elected. The result of the polling marks a new era in the history of Summerside. For the first time a straight temperance board has been elected and it rests with the new council to set at rest once for all the question as to the possibility or impossibility.

Mark Twain Describes the People Brits is Fighting With.

Mark Twain has met the Boer, and this is what he says of him: "He is deeply religious; profoundly ignorant, dull, obstinate, bigoted; uncleanly in his habits; hospitable, honest in his dealings with the whites, a hard master to his black servant; lazy, a good shot, good horseman, addicted to the chase; a lover of political independence, a good husband and father, not fond of herding together in towns, but liking the seclusion and remoteness and solitude and empty vastness and silence of the veldt; a man of mighty appetite and not delicate about what he eats; it with—well satisfied with pork and Indian corn and biltong, requiring only that the quantity shall not be stinted; willing to ride a long journey to take a hand in a rude all-night dance interspersed with vigorous feeding and boisterous jollity, but ready to ride twice as far for a prayer meeting; proud of his Dutch and Huguenot origin and its religious and military history; proud of his race and achievements in South Africa—its bold plunges into hostile and uncharted deserts in search of free solitudes unsexed by the pestering and detested English; also its victories over the natives and the British; proudest of all the direct and effusive personal interest which the Deity has always taken in its affairs. "He cannot read, he cannot," write, he has one or two newspapers, but he is apparently not aware of it; until lately he had no schools, and taught his children nothing; news is a term which has no meaning to him, and the thing itself he cares nothing about. He hates to be taxed, and resents it. He has stood stock still in South Africa for two centuries and a half, and would like to stand still till the end of time, for he has no sympathy with Utitander notions of progress. "He is hungry to be rich, for he is human; but his preference has been for riches in cattle, not in fine clothes and fine houses and gold and diamonds. The gold and diamonds have brought the godless stranger within his gates, also contamination and broken repose, and he wishes that they had never been discovered."—London Daily Mail.
