P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association Examinations.

The board of examiners of the P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association will meet for the purpose of examining candidates offering for registration on Jan. 31st 1907. Every candidate for examination shall satisfy the Council that he has served as assistant in a drug store for not less than four years and at least two of these years has been employed in the dispensing of prescriptions.

Candidates must give notice to the Secretary-Registrar in writing of their intention to present themselves for examination at least fifteen days before the date fixed for the examination. Such notice must be accompanied by examination fee of \$5.00, and by certificate to the satisfaction of the Council that the candidate possesses the qualifications above described. Any person entering his name and not presenting himself at the time and place fixed for the examination shall forfeit his fee to the Association.
