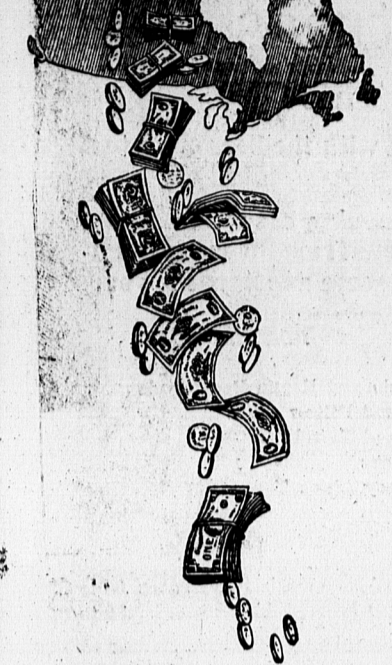

Your Aura, And What It Is

Surrounding everybody there is said to be an atmosphere or "aura," which is radiated from it some distance into space. This is most noticeable about the head, and is said to be the "halo" or "nimbus" which was portrayed by the old master about the head of Christ and other holy personages.

Baron Reichenbach made a study of this subject about the middle of the last century, and published an extensive work upon it; his view however received no credence and it remained for Dr. Killmer, of St. Thomas's Hospital, London, to prove scientifically that such an aura exists surrounding every human being.

He perfected a series of slides or screens by means of which this aura can be seen by nearly everybody. A coal-tar product known as "deyanin" renders the eyes of the onlooker susceptible to vibrations not ordinarily perceived. When the subject is viewed through these slides the aura may be distinctly seen surrounding the nude body of the subject, who must be placed against a black background in a semi-darkened room.

This misty atmosphere was shown to consist of three layers. First, there is a dark outline just touching the surface of the body, which he called "the etheric double." Extending two or three inches into space beyond this is a relatively dense layer, known as the "near aura." Beyond this again is a more tenuous layer, known as the "outer aura." 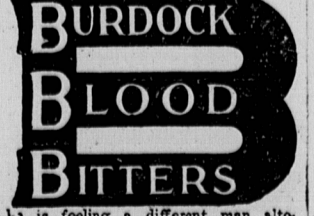
