after which the men were inspected at their guns to ensure their sobriety. Mondays were spent in gun-drill and drill with muskets and cutlasses. On Tuesdays the boats were "manned and armed" for exercise, and on Wednesdays they drilled with masts and yards. On Friday came "General Quarters," every gun in the ship being manned and exercised, while Saturday saw an orgy of cleaning ship in readiness for the captain's inspection on the morrow. So ended the sailor's weekly routine in a crack line-of-battle ship a century ago. It is a routine of which distinct traces may be found in the Navy of today.
