**BOARD ORDERS ARE BEING IGNORED**

OTTAWA, Oct. 25.—Chief Justice H. A. McKeown, of the Board of Railway Commissioners, declared in the course of a judgment handed down, "that specific orders of the Board have been and are now being ignored," by both Canadian railways.

The Chief Commissioner, in his judgment, quoted by the Board and comments upon it as follows:

"The correspondent in part above quoted, and the course of conduct indicated on the part of both railways, clearly show that the Board have been and are now being ignored. It also demonstrates that the whole question of interchange of traffic must be upon a basis which admits of no ambiguous construction, and above all, it must be made clear that the Board will not permit violation of its orders."

**BURNS MUSEUM ATTRACTS MORE AMERICAN VISITORS**

DUMFRIES, Scotland, Oct. 25.—Bobby Burns' great granddaughter, Miss Jean Armour Burns Brown, has had more Scotch-American visitors this year than ever before.

Tourists are coming in increasing numbers yearly to this quaint old border town to visit the Burns museum in the house in which the Scottish bard died. The beautiful mausoleum in St. Michael's cemetery, where his body lies, is nearby.

But even more interesting to visitors is the grey-haired great granddaughter of the poet who bears such a remarkable resemblance to her distinguished ancestor and sings Burns songs with great charm.

Miss Burns Brown has refused many offers to visit the United States, as she dreads publicity, and lives very simply in a modest flat in Dumfries. Her mother gave away most of the Burns relics the family possessed, so Miss Burns Brown has little of interest to Burns students in her home.

**KING REGRETS LACK OF WIFE, HE CONFESSES**

LONDON, Oct. 25.—Premier Mackenzie King apparently is regretting his lack of a wife. "I never missed Mrs. King so much in my life," he confessed at a meeting of the International Council of Women here.

Lady Aberdeen, who presided at the meeting, said Mr. King might feel that he was being trapped, but the women looked upon him as the patron saint or the father of the family of them all.

**Turk Leader Denies Bishop's Statement**

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 25.—A statement attributed to Bishop William T. Manning of the diocese of New York that evidence has been produced showing that thousands of Christian women are kept imprisoned in Turkish harems has just come to the attention of the Turkish press, whose reaction is a mixture of amusement and anger.

(Bishop Manning speaking before the Girls' Friendly Society on May 2, in New York, called attention to a pamphlet issued by the American Committee opposed to the Lusignan Treaty as containing matter substantiating charges that "more than 100,000 Christian women and girls are at this moment held in vile and loathsome captivity in Turkish harems").

Emphatically denying the truth of the Bishop's statement, the well known publicist and deputy Young Nady Bey, has written an editorial in the Ministerial organ Djurnal and the ferry service between Hamilton and outlying points.

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Oct. 25.—With the exception of the Colonial Opera House and Odd Fellows Hall which were completely wrecked, the damage from Friday's gale was of a minor nature. Some buildings lost portions of their roofs and a few plate glass windows were destroyed.

Telephone and electric light services have been resumed, as was the boat service in Hamilton harbor and the ferry service between Hamilton and outlying points.
